# WALK TO SCHOOL WEEK (May 20th - 24th)

The week-long challenge is not just about walking. Any type of exercise is encouraged, including **cycling, riding your scooter or even running.**

By the time this month's edition of the KBS news lands on your doorstep, our April production will be done and dusted. A big thank you to all those who came to see our evening of four one act plays, we hope you enjoyed them.

This year we celebrate our **75th anniversary**. The group was formed in 1949 and has been performing plays in the village for the local community ever since. We normally put productions on in April and November but to celebrate 75 years (and to raise money for our lighting fund, more below) we are adding in an **interactive murder mystery evening and afternoon this July**. There will be a different murderer for each performance. Our Murder Mysteries allow the audience to quiz the suspects and try to decide who the killer is! We have a compere; a two-act scripted play and then an audience question and answer session before the 'big reveal'. This year's production guarantees a lot of laughs and some showstopper moments.

#### The Lighting Fund

Kingston Bagpuize Drama Group is a not-for-profit group and while many things have changed since 1949 the struggle to fund productions remains constant. The cost of script licences, rehearsal spaces and venue hire are our biggest outgoings and mean we just about break even most years. Our biggest challenge now is replacing our current lighting system (last upgraded in 1986) with an energy efficient, sustainable LED system. We need to raise IRO £40,000 to do this. It's a huge challenge but a necessary one we are determined to achieve to ensure the group continues for the benefit of both current and future members and the community moving forward. 



# Prescriptions from the White Medical Practice in Faringdon



It appears that we only gave you half the information needed when ordering your prescriptions from White Horse Medical Practice in last month's KBS news.

We have since discovered that when you order a prescription you will later receive an email directing you to **Engage Consult**, the GP's online consultation system. From there you will be able to read the message telling you, 'Your prescription is ready for collection'. To use Engage Consult you must first register on that system. Our apologies for not providing this extra detail last month.







#### **MP David Johnston**

Along with the other Conservative MPs in Oxfordshire, I wrote to the CEO of **Thames Water to demand that more action is taken to tackle sewage pollution** in our waters, and have secured a meeting with him. The Government has taken decisive action to address the sewage issue, including putting in place the strictest ever

legally binding targets, which I was proud to vote for; increasing the monitoring of sewage discharges in England to 100% (up from 7% in 2010 under Labour); ensuring fines against water companies are unlimited; and requiring Thames Water and other water companies to deliver the largest ever infrastructure investment of £56 billion to fix this problem. However, people are rightly very angry about this issue, as am I, and I expect Thames Water to act with far greater urgency - which I will make clear during my meeting with the CEO.

I met with the **Roads Minister** to discuss my campaign to **improve our roads** and the results of my Local Roads Survey. The Government has given Oxfordshire County Council millions of extra pounds (a 30% funding increase this year) to improve our roads and fix our potholes. We discussed how they should use this money effectively, including filling potholes correctly and not in a way that means they reappear within weeks, as we all know often happens on our local roads.

Autism Family Support Oxfordshire provides vital support to parents across my constituency. Local families wrote to me after Oxfordshire County Council announced they were going to cut their funding which would have had a huge impact. I wrote to them on behalf of all my constituents who rely on this vital service and was glad to hear that the Council have (finally) listened and reversed their funding cut which will be a relief to many families.


Taking five trips of around 2 km a week on foot instead of a car can **decrease your carbon emissions** by 86 kg a year.





# Recipe of the month

#### Sticky lime & honey wings

www.bbcgoodfood.com/recipes/sticky-lime-honey-wings

May 20th is the World Bee Day and the recipe this month celebrates sweet and delicious honey and its ability to elevate any dishes!

#### **Ingredients - Serves 4**

- 1kg chicken wings
- 1 tbsp reduced-salt soy sauce 1 small cabbage (about 300g)
- 1 tsp chilli flakes (optional)
- · 2 tbsp honey
- 1 lime, zested and juiced
- 300g cooked rice, to serve

#### For the slaw

- 2 carrots
- 1 small red onion
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- · 2 tbsp lime juice
- 15g coriander (optional)



#### Method

Step 1: Tip the chicken wings into a large bowl and stir in the soy sauce, chilli flakes (if using), honey, lime zest and juice until the wings are coated. Set aside to marinate. Heat the oven to 210C/190C fan/6.

Step 2: To make the slaw, use a vegetable peeler to shave the carrots into strips, then finely slice the cabbage and red onion with either a sharp knife or mandoline. Put in a bowl with the olive oil and lime juice, and season to taste.

Step 3: Spread the wings out on a baking tray lined with baking parchment, then bake for 35 mins, turning halfway. Just before serving, stir the coriander, if using, through the slaw. Serve with the cooked rice.

## **Restaurant Review**

We are thrilled to announce the return of the restaurant review section in KBS News, where two local food enthusiasts will be exploring various pubs and restaurants in the area.



**The Bear and Ragged Staff, Appleton Road, Cumnor, OX2 9QH**We visited The Bear and Ragged Staff on Easter Monday for an early supper. It is a 12-minute drive from KBS. Off road parking is available. Wheelchair access is good.

We were immediately welcomed into the bar and shown to our table in the restaurant, which had been booked online a few days before. We were glad we had booked as the restaurant was becoming busy from 19.00hrs onwards.

**The restaurant was inviting** – has an everyday gastro dining vibe with well-spaced tables and more intimate booths. The seating

would suit couples, groups and families and single diners. Décor is modern and earthy with lantern style lighting. There was quiet background music. All age groups would enjoy the space and ambiance. There is **outside eating space** which is also non-smoking and non-vaping.



**Staff were attentive and helpful.** They offered us drinks and left us to mull over the menu. The drinks list is extensive. Lots of cocktails, non-alcoholic drinks and wines priced from £5.80-£7.90 for a 175ml glass to £26.50-£65 for a bottle.

The **food menu is wide-ranging** including vegetarian and vegan options. Starters were priced from £6.50-£11; mains from £16-£33 (sirloin steak) and puds and cheese from £7.25 to £9.80. The menu is seasonal. We had the spring menu – the crab cake and the courgette and artichoke starters were delicious, as were the main courses of Sri Lankan Curry and Pea and Broad Bean Risotto. The **food was beautifully presented** and **portions were generous**. It was lovely to see colour on the plates. The coffee was tasty.

The puds looked delicious and there was a good choice of ice creams and sorbets. Also, a mini pud with tea or coffee. **Children are welcomed** and they can have simplified versions of the menu or half portions.

At the point of payment the staff member was happy to allocate items to each of us and we paid for what we had consumed.

The restaurant is a member of the **Sustainable Restaurant Association** promoting environmental change within hospitality. Food and drink are sourced from suppliers with similar ethics.



It may be worth noting that the restaurant has nine bedrooms, including a suite and family rooms. They have facilities for private functions.

#### **District Councillor Jill Rayner's Report**



Water in the Vale - the Leader of the VOWH Cllr Bethia Thomas met with the Green Party to discuss the new Water Advisory Group which will focus on SESRO (The proposed and much opposed reservoir). With Farmoor Reservoir at such low levels whilst the surrounding areas are underwater it certainly raises the question of why a new reservoir should even be considered when this one can not be maintained or river water used to fill it as the sewage levels make this impossible.

**Did you know** - the week after Easter showed Thames Water had been discharging sewage into Kingston Bagpuize Brook for 89 hours?

**Homelessness** - following the government's proposals to criminalise homelessness the leader of VOWH sent a letter to the Secretary of State urging them to reconsider their position as we believe it would make our job in preventing homelessness locally even more difficult.

Good news for those of us that use Marcham Road Health Centre - The Cabinet has approved a request from Marcham Road Health Centre to draw down £966,097 of funding from the Vale of White Horse District Council healthcare CIL allocation.

Climate Action Fund opens 3rd May - The Climate Action Fund opens on 3rd May to help fund climate-related projects in the district. Previously grants have gone to EV chargers at a village hall, solar panels on a preschool building, creation of a wildlife habitat and carbon literacy training - to name just a few. The total funding available will be £100,000. The size of individual grants has doubled to a new maximum of £10,000 (minimum is £250). Please help spread the word so that local groups and organisations have plenty of time to get their information ready when we begin taking applications on Friday 3rd May.


#### **Longworth & District History Society**



The event will include a display of contemporary photographs of the village as it was in 1944, also depicting the airfield and the camps with their personnel of British and American forces. Ian Charlton and his recollections of the D-Day as an eight-year-old schoolboy, 80 years ago ...

#### **D-DAY.....AN ELDERLY SCHOOLBOY REMINISCES**

In May of 1944, I was just approaching my 8th birthday. I attended a preparatory school in Sunderland run by Mr Cheshire. He and most of his male teaching staff were all veterans of the Great War – 'The War to end all wars'. We were all very much in awe of him, but his greater claim to fame was his nephew – Group Captain Leonard Cheshire VC. Group Captain Cheshire did not receive his VC until later in the year, after the completion of 100 missions, and was rather disappointed that on the 5th and 6th of June, 617 Squadron was not strafing the landing beaches in Normandy, but was overflying the Pas de Calais dropping 'Window/ chaff' which spooked the German radar operators into thinking that a large amphibious landing force was approaching from the English Channel. We schoolboys were equally disappointed when he visited the school - not in uniform wearing his medal, but in a suit and overcoat!!

One day, towards the end of May 1944, a long column of trucks arrived in our village – Seaton, in County Durham about five miles inland from the mining town of Seaham Harbour. To us children it seemed as if they had arrived just out of the blue, but perhaps the powers that be and the local residents had some form of warning. Our house was at the top of a crest, approached by a drive with a small paddock on the right. Previously this field's only tenant had been my pony, Battleship, a retired pit-pony named after the winner of the 1938 Grand National. This small field soon became full of bell tents and a mess tent for the dozens of soldiers swarming round everywhere – very exciting for small boys who were just getting into the Biggles books and fascinated by everything to do with the military! It would seem that we had become a staging post for a Scottish Artillery regiment en route to the south of England in preparation for D-DAY, although of course we were unaware that that was the plan! A large marquee was erected on our back lawn, which became the officers' mess. On the other side of the garden wall, on the village green, the trucks were drawn up together with the guns that they were towing. Only ten years later, when I was a National Serviceman, did I discover that the guns were in fact Bofors anti-aircraft guns which were also to be used as anti-tank guns in the Normandy 'Bocage (mixed woodland and pasture)'.

The Colonel and some of his senior officers slept in our spare bedrooms and I believe they also ate in the house. Surrounded by farms, there was an endless supply of milk and eggs for all ranks, and the ladies of the WI rallied round baking cakes and scones. Officers were identified by their Glengarry bonnets and tartan trews, but all insignia had been removed so it was not possible to identify the regiment. On the morning of the second day, in the early hours we were woken up by the revving engines and by breakfast time it was as if they had never been there ... and as far as the records go, they never were! I have since tried to follow up the Council records to find out which regiment they were and where they were from but there is NO RECORD ... so we will never know ... *Ian Charlton*

# Magnus Macfarlane about Oxford Five Weathervanes walk

Oxford is rightly known for its dreaming spires, so often seen in people's advertising of the City. It's not just the spires; it's the silhouette, against the sometimes pale blue sky, which makes buildings look golden and vibrant. Hidden amongst all the splendour are five wonderful weathervanes.

Start your walk at the bus station at Gloucester Green. Atop the Chinese restaurant there is **the school teacher teaching children** at their desks. It's slightly bent at the moment! The best view of this vane is looking back from the road that leads to Walton Street. Be sure to look at the wonderful frieze above the door, which depicts a nun teaching girls to the left and a king teaching boys to the right. Probably culturally inappropriate in today's world.





Our second is atop Lloyds bank on the corner of Cornmarket Street. It is a magnificent **galleon in full sail**. Note the beehive frieze above the door, the symbol for Lloyds before the black horse.

The third is atop the Town Hall just down St Aldates. Here flies **the Ox of Oxford**. Do look just in the entrance steps and see the Oxford coat of arms - an Ox over water.



Our fourth is at the east end of Broad Street, opposite the King's Arms, atop the tower of the Oxford Martin School. It shows an **elephant with a howdah on its back**. This building was originally built as the Indian Institute, a place where civil servants could be trained before being sent out to administer the British Empire. Today the School predicts the future! For example, looking at people's health records to determine which new drugs should be developed. Keep your fingers crossed they are getting it right as it is your future they are looking after. Before you go, look at the wonderful frieze below the parapet, depicting some of the Hindu gods and to the left of the door at street level, Ganesha, the elephant God.





Lastly at Harris Manchester College on Mansfield Road find the magnificent vane on the Siew-Sngiem clock-tower, depicting a student late for a lecture powering along on his bicycle with his cape flying behind him. The inscription underneath reads "it's later than you think, but it's never too late". The wonderful pastiche classical architecture also incorporates the Suku Navapan Gate and provides a beautiful photo for the last stop on your walk.


