
The Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Village Website is in need of updating and the KBS News Team have taken on the task.



Proposal for changes to the A420 Speed Limits

Oxfordshire County Council Highways are **seeking the views of local residents** on a proposal to extend the existing 50mph speed limit on the A420 from the point it finishes east of KB&S to points beyond the central reservation pedestrian crossing point of the A420 at Kingston Bagpuize/Longworth, thereby covering the staggered junction with Pine Woods Road to Longworth, and the unnamed link road to the mini roundabout at the top of Spring Hill.



Road Coloured Red will have a 50mph limit Road Coloured Green will have a 40mph limit Road Coloured Blue continue as a 30mph limit



The above proposed changes are being put forward to help complement a scheme (not being considered as part of this consultation) – as shown in the additional improvement scheme 'Lining Plans' (Partially reproduced below) – whereby the carriageway will be reduced to a single lane in each direction through the staggered junction section, which is looking to address recognised safety concerns and a relatively high collision history. The proposals are part of OCCs 'Vision Zero' strategy, which seeks to work on a safe system approach to reducing fatal and severe injuries to road casualties, the Council proposes to reduce vehicle speeds to safer levels for road users, including pedestrians, cyclists, equestrians, motorcyclists, and all motorists. As stated on the notice, any objections or other representations on the proposals should be submitted by **Friday 10th October 2025.**



News from the Parish Council



6th October (Monday) and 3rd November (Monday) • Swallow Room • KBS Village Hall

The Parish Council met on 1st September in the Village Hall, attended by members of the council and County Councillor Lee Evans. Councillor Evans reported on several county matters affecting Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor, including school parking issues, safety concerns on the A420, and the ongoing closure of the Tenfoot pedestrian bridge on the Thames. He also confirmed that work is planned to improve drainage and that poor mobile phone coverage is being reviewed at county level.

Residents raised further concerns regarding proposed changes to refuse tip rules and the condition of Faringdon Road.

The Council considered a number of local projects and improvements. Updates were provided on the David Wilson Homes development (to be known as Ferrers Green), where discussions are ongoing regarding the use of S106 contributions for village infrastructure. Minor works will be carried out in the playground and recreation ground and new goal nets provided in the Millennium Green. The Council also approved the acquisition of an additional defibrillator to be installed at the One Stop Shop, supported by a resident's donation. Preparations for Remembrance Sunday were agreed, including the order of five wreaths with a donation and the invitation of members of the armed forces and other local dignitaries. Financial matters included the approval of monthly payments, review of the quarterly budget, and verification of bank reconciliations, with councillors noting that the external audit report for 2024–25 raised no issues. A tree survey contract was awarded, while the burial ground committee reported on boundary wall repairs and the replacement of the memorial tool shed.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) remains under review with the Vale. The Parish Council also agreed to apply for a boundary review to move the Ferrers Green development into KBS.

The next full Council meetings are scheduled for 6th October and 3rd November, with committee meetings to take place during September.

Neighbourhood Development Plan:

pre-submission After advice on the consultation, from the South and Vale Planning Policy Officers for NDP, the Steering Group met on Wednesday 10th September. Members considered and agreed changes to one section of the Draft NDP. The relevant pages are now being redrafted before being re-submitted. When the alterations are approved the KBSNDP can then be submitted for independent appraisal. At this time the full draft will be posted on the KBS PC website for comment by residents.

Recipe of the month

Roast pumpkin & spinach lasagne

Nothing is as comforting as a rich creamy lasagne and the sweet, earthy flavours of this veggie classic are well worth the effort www.bbcgoodfood.com/recipes/roast-pumpkin-spinach-lasagne

Preparation time: 25 mins Cooking Time: 2hr and 5 mins Serves: 6

Ingredients

- 750g Crown Prince Pumpkin or butternut squash
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 500g Spinach (washed)
- 1 tbsp butter (plus extra for greasing)
- Whole Nutmeg for grating
- 6 fresh lasagne sheets
- 100g parmesan

For the tomato sauce

- 1 medium onion finely chopped
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 celery stick, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves finely chopped
- 400g can cherry tomato
- 2 tsp light muscovado sugar

For the béchamel sauce

500ml full-fat milk
 ½ onion
 50g plain flour
 6 peppercorns
 1 bay leaf
 50g butter



Method

- 1. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Halve the pumpkin or squash, peel, deseed, then slice into 1cm slices. Toss with the oil in a roasting tin, season, then roast until tender and slightly charred at the edges. This can take up to 40 mins.
- 2. Meanwhile, make the tomato sauce. In a pan, soften the onion in the oil for 5 mins, then add the celery and garlic and cook for 1 min more. Add the tomatoes and sugar, then leave to simmer, uncovered, for 30 mins. Stir from time to time. You should be left with a thick purée. Season to taste.
- 3. Put the spinach in a saucepan with the water that still clings to it after washing, cover and put over a medium heat. Wilt the spinach for about 4 mins you'll need to turn it over with tongs every so often to make sure it all comes in contact with the heat at the bottom of the pan. When completely wilted, leave until cool enough to handle, then squeeze the water out with your hands. Chop and put in a pan with the butter. Gently heat, tossing together so the spinach is coated in butter, then season with salt, pepper and a generous grating of nutmeg.
- 4. For the bechamel sauce, bring the milk to the boil in a pan with the peppercorns, onion and bay leaf. Set aside for 5 mins to infuse, then strain the milk into another pan. Add the flour and butter, then gently heat, whisking all the while, until you have a thick, smooth sauce.
- 5. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6 and assemble the lasagne. Butter a large gratin or baking dish, roughly 1.4 litres in capacity. Put a layer of pumpkin in the bottom followed by a layer of tomato sauce. Lay lasagne sheets on top of this, cutting them to fit if necessary (you don't want any overlapping). Now add a layer of béchamel sauce followed by a scattering of spinach and half the cheese. Top with more lasagne sheets, pumpkin, tomato sauce, more lasagne and a final layer of béchamel sauce. Sprinkle the remaining cheese over the top. Bake for 40 mins, or until the lasagne is golden and bubbling.

All this talk of cemeteries and magic brings me onto my gruesome tale. WARNING – this next section has details that some may find alarming.


Sitting on the deck enjoying the last of the summer sunshine, a hornet suddenly appeared clutching a





Report from Cllr Lee Evans

I'm writing this month's KBS News report immediately after the latest County Council meeting, with a cup of tea and the last piece of cake I had left over from the recent Southmoor & Kingston Bagpuize Gardening Club Show. I had a lovely time at the show, seeing some of the 300 entries – from runner beans to loaves of bread, marrows to lemon curd! - submitted from across the village.

Unfortunately, my experience in County Hall was less positive. At every meeting of the County Council, Councillors can ask up to three questions of the ruling administration. Previously, I asked about the flooding on the A417, support for children with Special Educational Needs & Disabilities,

and unspent developer contributions. This time, I focused on Ten Foot Bridge, tips and the need for better road repairs.

I'm very frustrated with the Council's plans for our tips. Later this year, they plan to introduce a new system that requires us to book in before we dispose of our household waste. On top of that, the Council has undertaken a consultation on reducing the availability of tips, with no option to say we would like to continue with the current opening hours. All they are offering is cuts.

At the meeting, I asked what assessment the Council has made of the impact of their policies on fly-tipping, especially in rural areas like ours. Amazingly, they do not believe it will lead to any extra fly-tipping. In fact, the Cabinet Member said that the mandatory booking system and reduced opening hours "will improve the service for the majority [of] Oxfordshire's residents". I'm afraid that's simply not credible – and I said so in the Council Chamber. I'll continue to oppose the Council's plan for tips.

I used another of my questions to ask about roads like Faringdon Road, here in the village, which have lots of heavy vehicles using them. Residents who live on Faringdon Road have told me about how relatively small defects in the road can lead to noise and vibrations being felt in their homes. To prevent this from happening, I believe the threshold for repairing residential roads used by buses and HGVs should be lower than on other roads. I asked the Cabinet Member responsible for Transport Management whether he agreed.

I'm afraid to say he effectively shrugged off the question, referring to the Council's current highway inspection policy – which I believe is inadequate. I won't be settling for that as an answer and will continue to argue for roads like Faringdon Road, and others, to get the repairs they need. As a next step, I have written to the Highways Team at County Hall to urge them to reconsider their current approach during the next policy review.




Wherefor a classroom

Oxford University does not really exist. Not like other universities. It is made up of 43 independent self-governing colleges each with its own constitution and its own head. It's like dealing with 43 separate companies. It's a sort of federal system. The colleges are at home for the students. There are five things in each college: a dining hall for eating; a chapel to pray; a library to study; accommodation to live and gardens to relax. Beside the colleges there is the administration. It runs the gardens, such as the Botanic Gardens; the five free museums; the Bodleian Library, the central library of the university of Oxford; the classrooms, the lecture halls, the laboratories and the faculties of the University. Facilities evolved according to need and money available.

Saint Mary the Virgin's Church chancel still bears the scars of the carving of the students in the pews from when it was used as a classroom. The first purpose-built classroom was the Divinity School in the late 1400s. Until then rooms had been rented round Oxford to use as a classroom. In the early 1600s, we had the building of the old school's quad - with designated classrooms for each subject area. At last, a bit of central organisation.

The teaching of science was tagged on or into other subjects. This was remedied in the mid-1800s with the building of the Natural History Museum, which is really a building full of teaching facilities including

classrooms. The science area has continued to grow both next to University Parks and in the science parks developing around Oxford – most recently that red building in the North.



Ironically, Humanities have never had such central focus. Until now. The Radcliffe Quarter, formally



the Radcliffe Infirmary, is just coming to completion. Since the turn of this century, the Matthew Wales mathematical Institute has centralised both applied and pure maths. The Blavatnik school of government has centralised politics and now, in October 2025, the Stephen Schwartzman building will bring together seven humanities disciplines, with teaching facilities including classrooms all in one building. All of this has a central theme. Whereas before a much more silo subject teaching area had developed. New thinking in the University is to cross fertilise across subjects. It has even been happening on a college level. Our newest College, Ruben College, founded in 2019, expressly has the objective of cross fertilisation mixing students from the humanities and the science areas.
