

The Parish Council met in the Village Hall on 1st July and on 29th July. The minutes of the 3rd June and the 1st July meetings were agreed by Councillors as an accurate record of those meetings and are available on the Parish Council boards and on the Council's Website.

**Report from District Councillor Jill Rayner:** Proposal for MP's surgery in KBS in addition to Faringdon. VWHDC is awaiting details on the new Government housing policy. VWHDC has asked the local MP for a meeting with the government regarding Thames Water sewage and the proposed reservoir.

<u>Public Participation:</u> Renewed complaint about noise from generator at sewage treatment plant off Town Pond Lane. Thames Water informed the Clerk.

<u>Planning Applications:</u> P24/V1382/HH & P24/V1383/LB. Lamb and Flag House, Faringdon Road, Longworth OX13 5HN – Single storey rear extension, two windows north facing at ground floor, replacement and reinstatement of x 2 dormer windows and x 2 rooflights - north and west facing. Repositioning of modern staircase. Council voted no objections. P24/V1195/FUL E:440909 N: 198283 Oxford Road, Kingston Bagpuize (corner plot in south-west corner of Kingston Park). Construction of a single storey 'Young Persons Centre' building providing activity spaces and facilities to support local scout groups and young people. The Council voted no objections.

**Recreation and Play Facilities:** 1: Bark under Jubilee fort needs topping up. 2: Proposal by Clerk to engage Michael Carter of Sports & Play Consulting to draw up and manage tender process - Council accepted proposal and Clerk will set up arrangements.

<u>Burial Ground:</u> Ground work at the eastern end now completed, creating further capacity for interment of ashes. Work at western end is in process and will create 15 additional grave plots.

## Working towards a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

After discussions with VWHDC Parish Councillors voted in September 2023 to begin the process of applying for a Neighbourhood Development Plan. This is an 8-step process, which ultimately allows a Parish Council to respond on behalf of residents to applications for future development within the Parish.

The 1st step is now completed and was the designation of the area the NDP might ultimately cover. On the next page is the existing Parish Boundary plus the area of land between the Kingston Business Park and Fyfield Wick Road. (Area shown on the map edged by a blue line).


On 23rd July 2024 the Parish Council led a meeting to discuss the potential application for a Neighbourhood Development Plan. The impact of the changes in planning policy by the new government to Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor village are not yet clear, and in particular the merit of an NDP. None the less there are topics within an NDP which it would be beneficial to consider with information gathered held by the clerk for future reference.

Some of these topics fall within the scope of the 2nd step, which is the most time-consuming, requiring planning and drafting after consultation with residents. The first objective is to decide on the 'Settlement

Boundary' previously known as 'Village Envelope'. It is a line drawn on a plan around the village, reflecting its present built form and will define, amongst other things, what can and can't be built and where it should or should not be built. The Parish Council believes it is appropriate to pursue this topic irrespective of any forthcoming government clarification on the role of an NDP.

The next meeting for the NDP project is on Wednesday 4th September at 6.30pm in the Swallow Room at the Village Hall. Please come, your views are important!

## **Nature Notes**

Last month I mentioned in this column the dearth of insects this year, but also tempered my concerns by suggesting that with an improvement in the weather things might perhaps pick up. Sadly, from my own observations since then, and from those of others I speak to, there is a strong feeling that things haven't really improved as hoped.

Also, a few months ago, I wrote about Common Ragwort and how it has spread so widely. This year, presumably due to damper conditions it seems to have flowered profusely, but the orange and black Cinnabar moth caterpillars that normally feed on it are nowhere to be seen - at least, not in the places I've been looking.

So let's have some positive news. I received a nice little description from a reader on Hanney Road who has for the past few years managed his mother's front lawn as a flower meadow, which he tells me has attracted good numbers of pollinators this summer. Comments like this raise the

hopes that if we all did a little, we could help turn around what is undeniably a concerning situation.

On the home front, I had cause to nip up in our loft the other week. Being an old cottage with gaps in the eaves, we have over the years had mice getting in - and squirrels, but that's another story. We had been seeing what I'd assumed were occasional mouse droppings and suspected that they were back. So



imagine my surprise when a bat was suddenly flying around my ears. Talking with a friend who is an expert on the subject, I am told that by the location and the behaviour this is probably a Long-eared Bat and it is using my loft as a summer roost. In the evenings lately we've seen bats flying around the garden. I am hoping to set up my trail camera to get some shots of it, but in the meantime here is a photo sent to me of the flowers in the Hanney Road garden.

Lastly, I've not heard any reports of nesting Swifts or House Martins, so once

again, if you have them on your house, then please share the good news. I can be contacted as usual at *kbsnaturenotes@gmail.com*. *Peter Pool*



## Recipe of the month

## **Beetroot Veggie Burgers**

This juicy beetroot burger is topped with hummus and avocado with a halloumi and sweet potato salad.



**Preparation time:** 30mins to 1 hr **Cooking time:** 10 to 30 mins

## Ingredients for the beetroot burger (Serves 6)

- · 3 tbsp olive oil
- ·1 red onion, finely chopped
- · 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- · 2 raw beetroots, peeled and grated
- · 1 courgette, grated
- · 2 large carrots, peeled and grated
- · 100g/3½oz porridge oats
- · 400g tin chickpeas, drained
- · 1 large free-range egg yolk
- · 4 spring onions, thinly sliced
- · 3 tbsp finely chopped fresh coriander
- · sea salt and freshly ground black pepper



## To serve

- 6 wholewheat sourdough buns, halved
- · 230g/8oz hummus
- · 2 avocados, sliced
- ½ red cabbage, shredded

## **Preparation**

**Step 1:** To make the beetroot burger, heat 1 tablespoon of the oil in a large frying pan over a medium heat. Fry the onion and garlic for 4–5 minutes, or until soft. Add the grated vegetables and cook, stirring often, for 5 minutes, or until soft. Drain away any excess liquid released by the vegetables.

**Step 2:** Place the oats, chickpeas, tahini and egg yolk in a food processor and pulse to combine. Tip the mixture into a bowl and stir in the grated vegetables, spring onions and coriander. Season generously with salt and pepper.

**Step 3:** Divide the mixture into six and shape into burgers. Cover and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes (or up to 24 hours).

**Step 4:** Heat 2 tablespoons of oil in a frying pan over a medium heat. Cook the burgers, in batches if necessary, for 2–3 minutes on each side, or until golden and hot through.

**Step 5:** To serve, lightly toast the sourdough buns and top each base with hummus, avocado, red cabbage, a beetroot burger and the bun lid. Serve each burger with a handful of salad leaves topped with the griddled sweet potatoes and halloumi. **ENJOY!**

## **Restaurant Review**



## Lula's Ethiopian and Eritrean Cuisine, 21 Park End St, OX1 1HU



On an early Tuesday evening we headed into Oxford on the S6 bus. A short walk from the bus stop we arrived at Lula's Ethiopian and Eritrean Cuisine.

We were unaware that they had recently introduced a booking system so had not booked and although quite busy already. we were given a table at the back of the restaurant. The tables that overlook the street in the brighter side of the restaurant had been reserved so booking is probably a good idea and can be done online.

The restaurant is open Tuesday to Saturday from 9am to 3pm and then again from 6pm until 10 pm. The restaurant also has jazz evenings and does breakfast too. The vibe is a cross between a bistro and a cafeteria with well placed tables decorated with roses. There was jazz music playing in the background.

We were intrigued to sample the food having never sampled Ethiopian food and this restaurant is very well regarded.

The menu, although not huge, has an interesting selection of food and a good choice of vegan and vegetarian food and the meat options were either lamb or chicken. We ordered Lula's Gold Plate Vegetable platter to share.

The staff were attentive and friendly and asked if we wanted plates and cutlery as food is traditionally eaten directly from the sharing plate with the injera used to scoop the food and mop up the juices and sometimes used as a plate as well. We were not feeling that adventurous so went for the option of plates and spoons. We read up about injera as we waited and learnt that it is a sour fermented pancake with a slightly springy texture made with teff flour which is a healthy 'supergrain filled with complete proteins, fibre, magnesium and iron'.

The food came promptly and we enjoyed it as it had a variety of spiciness and flavours but with a similar soft texture. The injera had an unusual texture and although quite sour on its own, when eaten with the food it complemented

it well, and it was also entertaining eating it the traditional way. Everybody around us seemed to be enjoying themselves and had a buzzy feel.

The puddings were more routine. The carrot cake was tasty and the lemön cake quite sweet.

Of course, we finished our meal with Ethiopian coffee, cappuccino and americano, both delicious and a lovely end to an unusual, tasty meal at a good price in central Oxford served by friendly staff. Wilrich, Two KBS Foodies




Zero air miles free food with minimal packaging on offer from your local hedgerow!



## Aurora Borealis over Kingsmoor Clinic, Kingston Bagpuize

I thought I would send you this photograph that I managed to capture of the Aurora Borealis behind Kingsmoor Clinic, here in Kingston Bagpuize.



The Northern Lights were visible across most of the UK on the night of 12th August when I took this photograph. This is following a previous spectacular display on 10th May.

Glenn Wheatley runs the Northern Lights-UK Facebook group and he has explained in simple terms why we are seeing this incredible spectacle this year:

"Roughly every 11 years the magnetic poles on the sun flip. About 3 years before they flip, the sun catches a cold (so to speak), so starts sniffling and gets a sore throat, this is where the runny nose starts as Snot rises from the sun's core, which looks like acne on the sun's surface (sunspots). Eventually, all hell breaks loose and gets a full head cold. (Very near Solar Max), sometimes Sneezing up to 20 times a day. Maybe only one or two of these sneezes contain snot. In May the Sun

sneezed constantly for 24 hours, sending about 7 showers of Snot our way. Some pushed others faster and squashed up against others, making it feel like a blanket of snot, giving us epic displays. These really big sneezes or fits happen on average every 21 to 22 years. Once the Cold comes to a head, it eases a bit, then the sneezing gets bad again. After that it takes 2 to 3 years for it to shake off the cold. Then it goes quiet for about 5 years (Solar Minimum) it still can get an irritated nose and sneeze during Solar Minimum. It's just rare". Klair Price, Kingsmoor Clinic Owner







## Magnus Macfarlane The store corner

From time to time, I ask you to look up in Oxford. This time I'm going to suggest that you go up.


The latest public rooftop is at The Store. Some of you may recall in the dim and distant past there was a store called Boswell's opposite Debenhams (oops - that one's gone as well!). Founded by Francis Boswell in 1738, the business originally made and sold luggage. It is believed that Captain Cook used their trunks on his exploration of the Southern hemisphere. In 1912, it moved to its "present" location, and I'm sure many of you will mourn its passing. The name Boswell's is still engraved above the front door of what is now The Store, a new, very up-market hotel. It has an open-air cocktail bar on its roof. From here you get impressive views across St John's College

and down Broad Street.

There is something magical about being able to look down on vistas that we normally only see from the ground. Views from above open up a whole new

perspective, so that one can appreciate things in a different way. Sometimes seeing things that one would not normally see at all: the enormous copper beech in St John's; Balliol College laid out just under your nose; and the four statues on the tower of Trinity College Chapel – so much more impressive from this angle. The four female statues represent astronomy, geometry, medicine and theology, the key

subjects studied in the mid 1500s. Spot the golden flame in the foreground.





## Fleas are an absolute nuisance!

Often they will only jump on our 4-legged friends and catch a ride. But sometimes they will establish themselves in our homes and make life a misery.



The hoover is your best friend in this situation. At the first sign of invasion, be sure to vacuum daily, all around the edges of the room and in the nooks and crannies, as this is where they tend to hide and lay their eggs. Vibrations of the hoover can cause the eggs to hatch so keep up the vacuuming!

Wash all pet bedding at a minimum temperature of 65°C and, most importantly, keep up to date with your pet's vet prescribed flea treatments. They are slightly more pricey, but we find they are more effective than off-the-shelf brands!

## **Celebrating Harvest**





Hi! I have now moved in and am beginning to find my way around the village - thank you for your welcome! In some ways it feels strange to be talking about harvest now - a season when crops are gathered in, having been planted or tended and gathered or picked, usually involving significant effort. I don't feel I have much to gather in this year, though I have brought my pots of tomatoes and courgettes with me and there are apples, raspberries, currants and herbs in the vicarage garden.

For most of us the nearest we get to food production is a vegetable patch. But with fresh produce readily available in our supermarkets, now apparently independent of season or the elements, we generally find ourselves distanced from its source – and perhaps also from any sense of dependence on God for all that he gives us.

I'm just starting to meet people in the community, including a retired farmer, and I'm very aware of the crucial role the farming community plays in our everyday lives - usually unseen, unless we get stuck behind a tractor or a hay lorry, or notice the harvesting machines in the fields. However, for every mouthful we consume we are utterly dependent on the labour of agricultural workers in this country and overseas, and it can be very easy to forget that and to take them for granted.

So this harvest perhaps we can remember our farming community, pray for them and give thanks for them. And as we tend our gardens and vegetable plots with love and care may we encounter God in the goodness of his creation. And wherever we earn our living – in business or academia, in schools or in healthcare, in retirement or wherever – may we indeed know that 'all good gifts around us are sent from heaven above' – and 'thank the Lord, yes thank the Lord, for all his love'.

But I also hope our response doesn't end there – true gratitude overflows into generosity – so perhaps we could think a bit more about how we can care for those who are in need, and to care for our world and its fragile ecosystems – entrusted to us by God, and on which all our lives depend.
