

#### **News from the Parish Council**

## Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Parish Council Meeting Update Meeting held 6 October 2025

The Parish Council welcomed Sian Keeling, Development Director of David Wilson Homes, who provided an important update on the Ferrers Green development east of Kingston Bagpuize. Following feedback from local residents during public engagement, the original plan for a cricket pitch has been revised in favour of multi-use green spaces accessible to all residents year-round. The development will include a local centre with two retail units, with hopes to attract a pharmacy, as well as a new primary school to be built by the county council. A new link road between the A415 and A420 will feature roundabouts at each end, with traffic calming measures including buildouts near Sunrise Nursery and raising of the mini-roundabout by the Co-op.

District Councillor Jill Rayner reported that planning inspectors have recommended the withdrawal of the Joint Local Plan from the examination process due to unfulfilled cooperation requirements with Oxford City Council. The Council supported proposals for a new speed limit on the A420 and link roads, though members stressed the need for speed cameras to enforce the new limits. Traffic calming measures approved by Oxfordshire County Council will require substantial surveys and legal work, with costs to be included in next year's budget.

The Council made several decisions affecting village amenities and facilities. A teen shelter has now been installed at the recreation ground, and work is progressing on the bench trail project, with schoolchildren excitedly involved in designing the playground bench. The Council approved a one-off payment of £485 to restore the burial ground's north-eastern border, and agreed to fencing work along School Lane for £737, ensuring the well-used gap in the current fencing is retained. Additionally, the Council voted to support a community village website in partnership with KBS News, committing to a cost-effective three-year plan.

The Council met with Hallam Land regarding potential development around Kingston Bagpuize Business Park, expressing support for employment opportunities while emphasising the importance of protecting dog walking areas and dark skies.

Preparations for Remembrance Sunday, November 9, are well underway, with a Deputy Lieutenant of Oxfordshire, representatives from the Army, RAF and US Air Force all invited to attend. Road closure applications have been submitted, wreaths ordered, and arrangements made for a sound system and trumpeter.

**The Neighbourhood Development Plan** is progressing well, with final changes being made based on Vale requirements, including updating photographs. Once complete, the plan will undergo independent assessment before proceeding to a referendum, which requires approval from 51% of voters to pass.

The next Parish Council meetings are scheduled for Monday 3 November and Monday 1 December. Members of the public are always welcome to attend and participate during the public participation session.

#### Recipe of the month

#### Rumbledethumps

https://www.bbc.co.uk/food/recipes/rumbledethumps

Similar to bubble and squeak, rumbledethumps are a traditional Scottish dish of buttery mash, cabbage and swede, baked until golden brown and crispy. You can cook them earlier in the day and reheat in the oven – give them an extra 20 minutes or so from cold.

Prepare: less than 30 mins. Cook: 30 mins to 1 hour Serve: 6

#### **Ingredients**

- 600g/Ilb 5oz large potatoes, peeled and chopped into large chunks
- 400g/14oz swede (known as turnip in Scotland), peeled and chopped into large chunks
- 75g/23/40z butter
- 250g/9oz savoy cabbage or kale, finely sliced
- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 25g/loz cheddar, grated

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4.
- **2.** Cook the potatoes and swede in a saucepan of salted boiling water until tender. Drain well and return to the pan.
- **3.** Heat 50g/2oz butter in a pan and gently cook the cabbage for a few minutes, until the cabbage is tender but retains its colour.
- **4.** Add the cabbage to the pan with the potatoes and swede. Add the remaining 25g/loz butter and mash together using a potato masher. Season, to taste, with salt and freshly ground black pepper.
- **5.** Place the mashed vegetables into an ovenproof lidded dish and top with the cheese. Cover with a lid and bake in the oven for about 30 minutes, then remove the lid and continue to cook for a further 15 minutes, or until piping hot and golden-brown on top.



#### **The ADALI Restaurant**

#### 14 Wallingford Street, Wantage, OX12 8AX

We inadvertently visited this Turkish restaurant on a Thursday lunchtime ... long story! Following a planning error, we were guided there by the restaurant reviews on Google maps. After a few rounds of the one-way system we found it! It was definitely one of those days!

Just before the time of booking, we had been customers of the local Waitrose so we used their car park for an hour and a quarter whilst we went across the road to the Adali. Otherwise there is parking in the Market Square and shoppers' parking around the corner. Well signposted from the centre.

The restaurant was not busy so seating was easy on a table for two and service was quick. The overall appearance inside was cool and functional. Very low bench seats with seating for 4-6 and square tables for 2, 4, 6 or more. Someone was in the restaurant designing and booking a family celebration for 12 people. The food clearly has a good local reputation.

Be careful where you sit in the restaurant - the kitchen is open to view. My vegetarian friend had the discomfort of watching half an animal being chopped up. This possibly contributed to her lack of enjoyment of her vegetable Moussaka!



The full menu was comprehensive, covering vegetarian and vegan options as well as meat and fish dishes. Main courses were priced at £18-£20. There was a lunch menu with a good selection of dishes at a special price of £13.95 for 2 courses. Drinks were available - wines, spirits, beers, two cocktails and soft drinks. I chose Hummus to start and Chicken Guvec (casserole) for main. My friend had Tabbouleh to start, followed by Moussaka.

The picture below is of the starters. Abundant amounts of food. The hummus was tasty as were the warm flatbreads. The Tabbouleh was bereft of the cracked wheat and mint! Disappointing!



My chicken main was warming and pleasant. There was a lot of chicken together with aubergine and mushroom casseroled with cheese on top. The Moussaka was a bit oily and did not go down well.

We didn't have desserts although there was a fair selection of two typically Turkish dishes; a chocolate fudge cake; and ice cream.

The lady serving us was pleasant and helpful and allowed us to pay separately for what we ate. *Wilrich, two KBS foodies*







nuts, fruits and seeds - especially acorns. A mast year usually happens every 5-10 years and a single oak tree can produce 10,000 acorns. There was certainly a carpet of acorns underfoot and plenty still in the trees. The acorns shown are from the Pedunculate (or Common or English) Oak (Quercus robur). There were also lots of ivy flowers - a great source of nectar at this time of year for Great Admiral butterflies, bees and hornets. We also spotted plenty of sloe berries. This fruit of the blackthorn is too bitter to eat raw but can be used to make jam and, of course, sloe gin.

#### **Update from Charlie Maynard MP**

I am pleased to tell you that I have recently been appointed by our party leader, Sir Ed Davey MP, to Lib Dem Front Bench as Shadow Chief Secretary to the Treasury.

There are many challenges facing the UK financially, and I will use the role to highlight the issues facing all my constituents and Britons across the UK. At the same time I will also continue to seek to be an excellent local champion for the Witney constituency – standing up for the local community by continuing to address issues locally and working hard for them in Parliament.

The party's record 72 MPs have secured major concessions from the government including better support for family carers, solar panels on every new home and free school meals for every child in poverty.

On 15th September, I spoke in a debate about the terrible state of SEND provision across the country. I hear so many cases of families who are absolutely desperate to get support for their children. Yet waiting lists are horrendously long and schools are overwhelmed & underfunded. It is a massive, systemic issue and one that the Government urgently needs to get a grip on.

I've recently asked about how we can upskill teachers, as teacher training doesn't reflect the increasing number of pupils with SEND needing support in their classrooms. The Mulberry Bush school in Standlake, who I met with last month, does a fantastic job, leading outreach from specialist schools to share their knowledge and experience with teachers in mainstream schools. I'd love to see a similar model used across the country and have asked the Minister if there is scope to explore this. I know just what a huge challenge this is here in our area, and it is something I'm working hard on alongside councillors, council officers and school leaders, to try and build capacity in the SEND system locally.

I also spoke in Parliament in a debate over the Government's Bus Services' Bill highlighting concerns which had been raised with me by the excellent teams at West Oxfordshire Community Transport and First and Last Mile, who do such a great job locally. While the aims of the Bill are good, I am concerned that its provisions will have some negative unintended consequences for small operators and community transport providers. I've asked the Government to consider how this can be mitigated as it would be terrible to lose any of the community transport operators that we depend on locally.

This month I also attended a rally for a cause dear to my heart: Brain Cancer Justice. I was very proud to support my sister and a team who delivered a petition to 10 Downing Street, calling for more investment for research into treatments for brain cancer. Brain cancer is tragically the biggest cancer killer of children and adults under 40, yet it gets just 1% of the national spend on cancer. If you would be interested in signing the petition, I and everyone at Brain Cancer Justice would be so grateful for your support: Invest in brain cancer and give rights – turn terminal into treatable - Petitions.

#### Report from Cllr Lee Evans

Well, autumn is well and truly here and, alongside lovely things like harvest and autumnal colours, this time of year also comes with downsides - including worse weather. That's why I wanted to start this KBS News report by talking about drains.

In my view, drains and gullies in our area have not been cleaned out enough over the years, leading to flooding on the roads. That's why I was delighted when the County Council recently agreed to do a full clean of the drains. Lots of good work has been done, but several residents have got in touch to say that some drains have been missed. Rather than risk leaving these blocked, I'm currently going out across the area and

marking up drains that need urgent attention. If there are any blocked drains that you are aware of, please do let me know.

Alongside drains, another issue I'm working on is poor phone signal in KBS and nearby villages. I recently addressed a meeting of Oxfordshire County Council on plans to map mobile phone signals across the county, urging the Council to focus on concrete steps to improve coverage. I've also raised the issue with the Digital Infrastructure Team at County Hall and asked them to consider what could be done to improve things in our area. I'll report back on my progress.

You may have seen headlines recently about the County Council's plans for switching off some streetlights in Oxfordshire. Under the proposals, the local County Councillor will have to sign off on any plan to switch the lights off, so I wanted to be clear about my view on this. For the sake of public safety, I would not agree to the County Council switching off any streetlights in the Kingston & Stanford division. The only exceptions I would consider are if there is significant public demand for a change and the police were satisfied it would not pose a risk to public safety.

Finally, something I'm sure you have seen in the news: the Oxford Congestion Charge. Despite significant public opposition, the County Council is going ahead with a £5 per day charge to drive a car through six charge locations in Oxford. Personally, I'm opposed to it. I think it isn't necessary and will likely make issues of congestion on the Oxford ring road worse. I also think it's a barrier to people in our area travelling into Oxford - something which has already been made much too difficult by the problems with the Botley Road. Nevertheless, I'm afraid the Council leadership is determined to go ahead and the new charge will apply from 29th October.

One crumb of comfort is that we can apply for a permit with 25 day passes per year. (There are other permits with exemptions, too, including for people with blue badges). If you are likely to drive into Oxford via one of the charge points, it is worth getting a permit. Please do visit the Oxfordshire County Council website to find out more.

#### **Youth Matters**

Hello! I hope that everyone had a lovely October and a great half-term. It's certainly looking very autumnal now! The leaves on the foliage around the village are slowly turning brown and falling off, which can be quite sad, but I see it as the plants getting ready to grow new ones in the spring next year. In this month's article, I thought I would talk about the science behind autumn and answer questions that might frequently come up about this season!

#### Why do we have seasons?

Whilst November signifies autumn in the Northern Hemisphere (where the UK is), it is late spring in the Southern Hemisphere. It seems very odd that whilst we are inside, drinking hot chocolate and wrapping up warm because of the weather, countries such as Australia are coming into their summertime! This is because of the way the Earth tilts on its axis. The Earth is tilted ever so slightly and does not rotate completely straight. At the moment, our side of the Earth is beginning to tilt away from the Sun and countries on the other side of the world are beginning to tilt towards it – this is why seasons happen and it gets warmer and colder.

#### Why are leaves changing colour?

Leaves have a special part called chlorophyll, this makes the leaves green. Chlorophyll helps with photosynthesis – this is when plants make their own food. In autumn, chlorophyll breaks down and the leaf begins to turn brown!


#### Why do animals hibernate?

Animals hibernate because when it begins to get cold and food is hard to find, it is important to save energy. Animals sleep for long periods of time throughout autumn and winter so that they don't have to waste energy looking for food; the animals then wake up when winter is over and food is plentiful.
