Every Thursday 9.00am – 12 Noon in the Village Hall, the dynamic duo of Caroline Ashby and Ruth Hastings organise the KBS Café, on behalf of St. John the Baptist Church, with a group of other volunteers. This is a warm place where people can meet, chat, enjoy a cuppa for £1 and a slice of homemade cake for another £1. It is usually really well attended in dry weather but when it rains, or is windy, some older members of the community find it too hard to battle the elements. There are also other people who, whatever the weather, are not able to leave their home unaided. To have some form of Community transport on a Thursday morning would be wonderful as some people are feeling isolated in their own home.

There is also the wonderful Cedar Community Club in Hinton Waldrist, run by Claire, Helen and Sandra, with the help of volunteers, on a Tuesday and Wednesday 9.30am – 3.00pm. There are volunteer drivers who help with transport, but potentially more people could access the club if there was transport.

It is felt that we need to gauge the level of interest in the possibility of having community transport before we go any further as this will not be easy to organise. In fact it may not be possible but nothing ventured, nothing gained!

This year's free safety tests for electric blankets will again be available at Wantage Fire Station – Ormond Road, Wantage OX12 8DU - on Friday 4th October.



September at Millennium Green Junior Parkrun



Every Sunday morning at 9am • Millennium Green

After a quieter summer when many of our regulars were on holiday (and hopefully trying out some Parkruns in other locations) it is lovely to see our running numbers boosted back up in September. After a lot of rain over these last few weeks, it's a bit easier to get the finish funnel stakes into the ground too!

September started with a smash of the course record which now stands at 7 minutes and 29 seconds for the 2km route. But it was equally fantastic to see some of our youngest runners now making it round the course without stopping and running the whole way too.



What is a Junior Parkrun? It is for children aged 4 to 14 (and their families) to run a timed 2km run every Sunday morning at 9.00am. It is free and it is fun and there is no time limit to complete the course. It's easy to register with Parkrun, just head over to their website https://www.parkrun.org.uk/ and you can complete a free registration form in a matter of minutes. You will then have a unique barcode which is scanned each time you run so you can track your progress. You can earn wristbands for completing a specific number of runs (11, 22, 50, 100, 250) and you can take your barcode to any other Parkrun in the country (and abroad) and take part in another junior parkrun or even join the adults on a Saturday morning (providing a parent or family member can run and keep up with you).

Too old to be a junior runner but want to volunteer? We welcome volunteers to help each week and we always need marshals, time keepers, barcode scanners and people to set up and clear away. If you register with Parkrun as well then we can book you in and you can earn volunteer credits for t-shirts for

all the times you volunteer. Plus you get to be part of a happy band of volunteers who like to get up and out on a Sunday morning and cheer on our amazing runners.



Report from District Councillor Jill Rayner: VWHDC has published a rejection of Thames Water's plan for a mega reservoir. Nature Notes - Major House Building Needed

Last month I made a bit of a request for any sightings of breeding House

Martins and I'm pleased to report that I had a few positive email responses including one with a very nice video clip of the birds flying up into their nests. So it is good news to hear that in what feels to have been a generally poor year for them, we do at least still have a few pairs nesting in the village. By September most had their young out of the nests and were feeding up for their long southward migration. Several times in the last few weeks my eyes have been drawn skyward as I heard their chattering calls as they circled overhead but as soon as the weather calmed by mid month they were off and things quietened down.

I've been hearing the shrill kee-kee-kee calls of Kestrels fairly regularly of late. This is pleasing because my garden backs onto farmland and last year I put up a nest box for them (picture left). Back in the spring I had high hopes that they

would use it this summer but a pair of Stock Doves took a liking to it and won possession for a while, although in the end, even they didn't breed there. My feeling is that the Kestrels may do better next season as they seem to be staking their claim early, so fingers crossed. Looking around the

house and garden I counted up that I have seven nest boxes of various shapes and sizes but the birds could always do with more. Three are for Blue Tits which take readily to them. One, on the house, has been in regular use



for well over 30 years. Another, on the back of the shed, is used intermittently and as the hole has become enlarged it is more often favoured by Great Tits but this year there was nothing. The box that I built for Swifts also got occupied by Great Tits before the Swifts were even back in the country. So with the darker evenings coming along I plan to spend some time knocking up a few more boxes, of various shapes and sizes, from bits of scrap wood. Perhaps if you have places you can put them up, you might consider doing the same.

The Cherry Tree is a 150-year-old pub with a bar and restaurant. It also has rooms and is a 20-minute drive from KBS via the Hanneys.

There was ample parking at the back of the pub (don't go into the next-door Fox pub car park by mistake!). There is a large courtyard/ patio area for eating and drinking in the warmer weather.

We had previously booked a table by email on cherrytreesteventon@gmail.com. Kayley welcomed us warmly and showed us to our table. We had attentive service throughout our stay. The pub is olde worlde with wooden beams and an open fire. I imagine it to be cosy in the winter.

There are a couple of steps on the way from bar to restaurant, so assistance would be required for people with certain disabilities. The staff

The menu is comprehensive and reasonably priced and there is a children's menu and a Specials board.




20 years ago, a student attending their examinations in examination hall, requested a free pint of beer from one of the adjudicators just before his exam. The adjudicator started to

The Lighter Shade of Pale

I have been wanting to share the recent adventures of 'our' toad. 'Our' toad is (almost) certainly a Common Toad, which means that "despite its warts and ancient associations with witches" it is a gardener's friend, "sucking up slugs and snails." So says the Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust: https://www.bbowt.org.uk/.

It's also protected in the UK under the Wildlife and Countryside Act, 1981, which is especially good to know in view of the time it took for us to protect this errant amphibian and return it to the relative comfort of its habitat in our garden in KBS.

Let me give you an unexpurgated account of the travels of 'Our' toad one sunny Saturday, sharing 'live' updates from the family WhatsApp group. *To family:*

16.10 "I'm trapped in Dad's car with a toad. Send sympathy."

16.11 "I'm holding my feet up. Unsure how this will help. [Pause]. "My teeth are gritted."

16.17 "Dad says he feels the presence of the toad behind his back in the driving seat."

16.18 "The journey home from the tip is further than I remembered."

What enticed our toad to go wandering? We have a hunch that in the hullabaloo of loading the car for the tip (destination 2 on our outing), it quietly concealed itself in the foot of a grimy disused water feature which we were throwing out. Toads are, though, genuine adventurers. The first warm damp evenings of the year, often in mid-February, find toads heading out en masse, travelling back to their breeding ponds. They face a perilous journey as our roads and towns pose a real threat. In fact some 20 tonnes of toads are killed on the UK's roads each year. Gruesome! Where more than 1000 toads are known to favour a particular spot to hop across a road, it is called a 'toad crossing' and help may well be at hand. Right across England, local volunteers, known as 'Toad patrols', gather to help them cross the road safely.

Remembering that you may have to kiss a lot of frogs to find your Prince Charming or Cinderella, you might try for a romantic adventure of a different kind next Valentine's day? Find out more about the active Toad Patrols within 10 miles of KBS at https://www.froglife.org/. Sue

Pest Corner

Wasp stings can catch you by surprise!



Even this Pestie, whilst putting on her Bee suit, was subject to a nasty sting on the back of her neck this month. My first and probably not my last!

Wasps sting when they feel threatened and as we near the

end of the season, they start to become more aggressive before their life cycle (up to 35 days depending on the species) comes to an end. To treat a sting, wash it with soap and water and apply a cold compress, like an ice pack, for at least 10 mins. It can be itchy, try not to scratch it!
