# Willowfields Energy Park


In the November KBS News we included a report of a proposed Solar Panel Farm to be installed in an area covering some of the fields to the rear of Millets Farm Centre going down to the River Ock.

This proposal has now been submitted to the Vale of White Horse District Council (VOWHDC) seeking planning permission for the construction and operation of a renewable energy park comprising ground mounted solar photovoltaics (PV) together with associated infrastructure, including inverters, transformers, substation, security cameras, fencing, access, landscaping and cabling.





### Village Walk and Talk

The first Walk and Talk of the new year took place on a fine sunny morning on Thursday the 30th January. The Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Parish Council met on February 3rd to discuss important local matters.

- District Councillor Jill Rayner provided updates on ongoing initiatives, including discussions on devolution affecting Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire, and Berkshire. A new permit scheme for garden bins will be introduced in April, and residents were encouraged to apply for free gym membership through the Better Leisure sports foundation before the February 20th deadline. The District Council also reviewed feedback on the local nature recovery strategy, which received strong community engagement.
- One of the major topics was the proposed Willowfields Energy Park, a renewable energy project currently under review. The Council decided to defer its decision to allow further research and discussion at the next meeting.
- Parish Councillors approved a switch to a government-backed website and email domain to enhance transparency and professionalism.
- Plans for improved recreational facilities were also advanced, including the purchase of new goalposts for the local playing field, supported by recommendations from Kingston Colts.
- Efforts to enhance road safety and traffic management were reviewed following a feasibility study on potential calming measures for Witney Road and Springhill. Recommendations include physical traffic control features rather than electronic warnings. Funding opportunities, including grants from the Police & Crime Commissioner's fund, will be explored to support these measures.

Residents are reminded that the next Parish Council meeting is scheduled for March 3rd, and all residents are welcome to attend.

### Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

The meeting of the NDP Steering group was held at the tearoom in Kingston Bagpuize House to advance the planning process.

Key updates were confirmation that the NDP grant application has been successful with funds now available for instructing a copywriter to start preparing the first draft of the plan and the consultancy MJA to advise Transport, business opportunities, infrastructure and flood risk.

### **KBS Nature**

Well, the UK has certainly had some weather over the winter but that hasn't deterred me from enjoying what nature has to offer. At the end of 2024, the Unofficial Friday Walking Club had a trip to Wytham Woods (permits are required) on a beautiful cold and crisp morning. The hoar frost made the whole place magical, and certainly provided some post-Christmas

cheer. There was not a lot of wildlife on offer (hunkered down against the cold no doubt), but we were entertained by several robins en route and delighted to see a mass of redwings in the trees. These winter visitors are members of the thrush family and are distinguishable by the red blushing under their wings.

Talking of birds, the weekend of 24-26 January 2025 was the annual RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch. Myself and hubby dutifully sat down at 1.25pm on the Saturday for the one hour of counting, binoculars and obligatory mug of tea at the ready ... and, of course, all the birds immediately vanished! Undeterred, we patiently waited and were eventually rewarded with a greater variety of birds than in 2024, but sadly lower numbers. When we first moved to the village over 20 years ago, we couldn't count the number of sparrows as they were so prevalent. This year, we were pleased to see four together.

So, here is a table of what we did see.

Did anyone see any other species or note anything different in the numbers observed? I would be interested to hear! By the way, the mystery visitor from a previous BGB I posted in last month's edition was a waxwing. There were 5 of them that paid a visit to a bush in the garden loaded with yellow berries. That's the only time I have seen them and it was a real treat.

A few days after this year's BGB, I looked out of the window and typically the feeders were teeming with birds, more than you can shake a stick at until ... BOSH!!! The young male sparrowhawk swooped in to spoil the party (I've named him Flashheart after the Rik Mayall character in Blackadder). It was a close call, but no casualties, and Flashheart swept around disappearing up the garden like a typhoon jet. He came back round for a second



# Recipe of the month

# Healthy sweet and sour chicken

www.bbc.co.uk/food/recipes/sweet\_and\_sour\_chicken\_52908

This is exactly like your favourite sweet and sour from the local down the road, but with fewer calories. Proves that a diet doesn't have to be all about denial. This meal without rice provides 288 kcal, 20g protein, 38g carbohydrate (of which 29g sugars), 7g fat (of which 1g saturates), 3g fibre and 0.1g salt per portion.

## Ingredients (Serves 4)

- 1 x 425g/15oz can pineapple chunks in natural juice
- · 2 tbsp cornflour
- · 2 tbsp dark soy sauce
- · 2 tbsp white wine vinegar
- · 2 tbsp tomato ketchup
- · 2 tbsp soft light brown sugar
- · 2 tbsp sunflower oil
- ½ tsp dried chilli flakes
- 1 x 225g/8oz can water chestnuts
- · 2 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- · 1 medium onion, cut into 12 wedges
- 2 peppers, red, green, orange or yellow, deseeded and cut into chunks of about 3cm/1½in
- · 2 garlic cloves, peeled and crushed
- 25g/loz piece fresh root ginger, peeled and finely grated
- freshly ground black pepper

# Preparation - less than 30 mins

- 1. To make the sauce, drain the pineapple in a sieve over a bowl and keep all the juice you should have about 150ml/5fl oz. Put the cornflour in a large bowl and stir in three tablespoons of the pineapple juice to make a smooth paste. Add the remaining juice and 150ml/5fl oz water, then stir in the soy sauce, vinegar, sugar, ketchup and chilli flakes until thoroughly combined. Set aside.
- **2.** Cut each chicken breast into eight or nine even pieces. Heat a tablespoon of the oil in a large non-stick frying pan or wok and stir-fry the onion and peppers for two minutes over a high heat. Drain the water chestnuts and cut them in half horizontally.
- **3.** Add the remaining oil and the chicken to the pan and stirfry for two minutes until coloured on all sides. Add the garlic, ginger, pineapple chunks and water chestnuts and stir-fry for 30–60 seconds.
- **4.** Give the cornflour and pineapple mixture a good stir and add it to the pan with the chicken and vegetables. Stir well, season with some ground black pepper and bring to a simmer. Cook for 4–6 minutes until the sauce is thickened and glossy and the chicken is tender and cooked throughout, turning the chicken and vegetables a few times. Serve with a small portion of rice.

# **Restaurant Review**



# THE GREYHOUND, Telephone 01865 862110 Near Wootton, Abingdon, OX13 5PX.



We booked online via The Greyhound website for a Monday early evening meal. It's good to know what is open on a Monday! I hadn't been to the Greyhound since the new management team was established, headed by Ryan.

It is a beautiful building situated just off the A420 (12-minute drive from KBS) and has plenty of off-road parking. You can also travel there by the S6 bus which has a stop outside the pub. So easy and no worries about having an extra tipple! There is a very pleasant garden and patio area. The entrance is wheelchair friendly.

There was a welcome from the bar staff. The reservation was checked and we were shown to our table. There are three sitting areas which gives the restaurant good capacity without tables being too close together. The character is traditional whilst not being old-fashioned.

We were seated in the section which has beams, a lovely wooden floor, log fire and good lighting. There are books on display and prints on the walls and a pair of greyhound bookends next to our



table. It was quite busy for an early evening and got busier as time passed. There was a relaxed yet efficient ambience - family friendly too. The staff were helpful. They knew the menu and could make recommendations based on our questions.



The seasonal menu is comprehensive. There are nibbles and starters; light bites until 1700; as well as main courses and puddings. Prices are £17.45 for crispy beef salad. The crunchy and tasty beef was combined with vegetables and nuts; £20.95 for fish pie and vegetables. The pie was well presented and

included plenty of fish. Main course portions were wholesome and very enjoyable. Small desserts were on offer with coffee for £8.95 - a great alternative to a larger dessert. The coffee was also served with a bite of flapjack -nice touch! There were definitely other appealing items on the menu, which would entice us back for more!

The Greyhound organises dog walks and has a circular walking route for you to follow. They organise celebrations throughout the year, eg St Valentine's Day, Mother's and Father's Days, etc.

At our first meeting in February, we each worked on our own work as we picked dates for our first group projects.



### **Short Mat Scoring explained**

In the Oxford County Short Mat league, two teams from each club play two teams from another club. Short mat is played indoors on a mat 45 feet by 6 feet. Three members form a team (i.e. triples). Each player has 3 bowls to bowl. The match consists of 12 ends. Six ends bowled one way and six the other. The idea is to get as many of your bowls closest to the Jack. The Jack (small ball Yellow or White) is what you are aiming at. When all the bowls are bowled, the number of bowls of your teams closest to the Jack are counted against the opponent's bowls. If your team has more bowls closest to the jack (shots), they are counted and recorded on the scorecard. At the end of 12 ends, the scores of each team are counted. The team with the most shots wins that match (2 points). When both teams have played 12 ends each, the scores from both teams are counted. The maximum points available is 8. If both teams win a match the score is 2 points each, unless one team has more shots overall they would get 6 points and the other team 2 points. If a team draws a match with their opponent they score 1 point each.



# **Balliol College origins**

Recently, I ran a tutorial for fellow Guides on visiting Balliol College, one of the oldest and a personal favourite, as there is so much to see and do there.

There are three colleges in Oxford that claim to be the oldest and each, in its own way, is correct. Balliol's claim is that it has been a community of scholars on its present site without interruption since inception, 1263. It was founded by John de

Balliol, a descendant of the Norman knights who had come with William the Conqueror. John de Balliol was born in France on the family lands of Bailleul-en-Vimeu, Picardy, but mostly brought up in Barnard Castle in Durham. He had a dispute with the bishop about some land so the bishop detained him. King Henry III intervened. John had to do a penance in two parts. Firstly, he was taken to the square in Durham and publicly flogged. For the second part, he had to do a charitable act. He founded a college for the education of 16 poor boys.

John died shortly after, and it was his wife, Dervorguilla, who made sure that the College survived. She was a Scottish princess from Galloway. She ensured its continuity, giving it a permanent endowment and statutes in 1282.

Their son John Balliol became King of Scotland as the great, great, great grandson of David I. He had no male issue and it's interesting to see on the Balliol website that the College says it has no records of his family tree.

It seems that the ancestral hunters have been asking questions. Dervorguilla had John's heart removed and placed in an ivory casket, which was always placed on a pillow in her bed. He also had a place at dinner, where the uneaten food was given to

the poor. Dervorguilla also founded Sweetheart Abbey near Dumfries. The skeleton of this magnificent structure stands to this day as a testament to her love.

The crest of the College is the lion rampant of Galloway joined with the red shield of Balliol. The portraits shown are a rather crude pastiche of Dervorguilla, and John in a full set of armour. His was painted 200 years after his death by

which time he was not good portrait material.

# Thermal imaging camera update from the village Environment and Climate Group

The recent offer to residents to have a free infra-red thermal imaging camera survey of their properties was taken up by around 25 households in KBS during January. This facility was available thanks to the loan of a thermal camera from the Vale of White Horse District Council Climate Group.

We were fortunate it was particularly cold and dry when doing the surveys so heat loss from the warm houses generally showed up well, even if the surveyors themselves were a little on the chilly side. Individual home owners were afterwards provided with images that enabled them to see the areas that were losing the most heat and areas that were better insulated.

The types of properties visited ranged from a number of older houses including ones with solid walls or minimal cavity insulation right the way through to several new builds, built to modern energy conserving building regulations standards.

A number of interesting observations were made, very often confirming the owners' knowledge of where they had already been considering doing some remedial work. In some older properties, a wooden front door was often better insulated than the walls. We also found that many of the modern plastic front or back doors were losing more heat than from double glazed windows. On some, the presence of radiators on outside walls were only too obvious. Heavy curtains inside go a long way to retaining heat in a room as does a draught excluder on the letterbox as well as reflective insulation behind radiators.

Only a limited number of surveys could be undertaken as we only had the camera for 3 weeks and a small team doing the surveys, but this may be expanded in the future. Surveys were generally from outside of the properties but a lot can also be gained from the inside, by looking for cold spots.

Grants can be obtained from various sources to help with energy saving projects, so this is something that the Environment and Climate Group might investigate further. In the meantime, anyone wanting to find out more about how to help keep their home warm and reduce their bills can find out more information by making a free phone call to **Better Housing Better Health on 0800 107 0044** or look at their website at **www.bhbh.org.uk**.

Oxfordshire County Council also has funding available to support eligible residents to save money. You can also do an internet search under "loan thermal imaging camera" if you are considering the option of borrowing or hiring a thermal camera for yourself.

# From our MP Charlie Maynard

I hope you and your family have been keeping well this last month. I am sure you are as happy as I am that warmer spring days are hopefully just around the corner!

I have been campaigning very hard on the need for the Government to get tough with failing Thames Water.

Across Witney, we received letters this month telling us to expect our bills to go up by an average of £19 per month over the next year. I have raised with Ministers the distress this is causing, especially at a time when household budgets are so tight.

Early in February, Thames Water asked the High Court to let them take on another £3bn of debt, which I think is unacceptable and will only make their financial position worse. Working alongside Windrush Against Sewage Pollution (WASP), I submitted evidence to the Court urging them to reject the proposal, as I do not believe it is in the interest of Thames Water's customers. After all, we are the ones who will pay for the debt through our bills! At the time of writing, we are still waiting for the judgement, and I will keep constituents updated. Please google it or visit my socials for more information. It has been covered by the BBC, The Guardian, the FT and others.

My last month has been full of interesting visits. I've been lucky enough to see lots of good work going on in our constituency, but also to hear about issues and challenges people are facing.

Among these were a lovely visit to Hailey Primary School, a small school of 93 pupils and 4 teachers, where we talked about the challenges of school budgets, and especially how they support the growing number of pupils with special needs.

I also visited Edgars, a planning consultancy in Witney where we had an interesting conversation around skills, apprenticeships, the Witney rail project and how the revised National Planning Policy Framework could impact us locally.

It was also a pleasure, as always, to attend Witney MP Watch's Climate Matters meeting, where we spoke about Parliamentary processes and my campaign to rebuild the railway between Carterton, Witney and Oxford as a way to reduce congestion on local roads.

A big thank you also goes to Witney Rotary for an enjoyable meeting, where I was asked about my time as MP for Witney so far and to share my goals for the future. What a great group, working hard to raise funds for charity!

As ever, I'm extremely grateful for everyone who has taken the time to meet with me.

Further, in my role on the Business and Trade Select Committee, I get the chance to question Ministers on how we can tackle the cost-of-living crisis and get our economy growing again. I've recently asked the Minister for Trade about our free trade agreements and how we can get growth back on track.

Looking ahead, I am very pleased that the Government has confirmed that County Council elections will go ahead in Oxfordshire this May, following some uncertainty around the planned Local Government reorganisation. Whatever your political views, it can only be a good thing that democratic processes are able to go ahead, and you get a chance to hold your local elected representatives to account!
