

The Parish Council have invested in a new heated Defibrillator cabinet which has been installed on the front of the Village Hall by the side door to the Kitchen entrance, adjacent to the Disabled Parking Spaces.

The cabinet was installed by Graham Miller of IGM Electrical Ltd. This was carried out free of charge as a service to our community. The picture shows Graham alongside his handywork.

Should it ever be required, the instructions are to CALL 999; Tell the operator where you are calling from, and you will be given the 4 digit access code to open the cabinet to access the defibrillator. Start CPR as soon as possible.

Numbers vary each week between 20 and 100, depending on events.

The Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Parish Council met on April 7th to discuss key local matters affecting the community. David Weeks was co-opted onto the council following the withdrawal of another candidate.

The meeting covered a broad range of topics, including a detailed report from District Councillor Jill Rayner, who shared updates on the upcoming County Council election and the ongoing negotiations about a potential unitary authority. The council also heard about positive early feedback on the new garden waste scheme and was encouraged to explore grant opportunities via the Climate Action Fund.

Several key projects and purchases were approved to improve village amenities. A new defibrillator cabinet will be installed free of charge, thanks to Graham Miller of IGM Electrical. Elizabeth Bailey has joined as Outdoor Officer, already completing training for playground inspections. The council also approved quotes for new seating and lawn care in the burial ground and discussed further improvements to the recreation ground, including the possibility of an open-sided shelter. Significant investment continues with playground upgrades and the ongoing development of the Neighbourhood Development Plan, which will guide future growth and community needs.

**Financial matters were thoroughly reviewed**, with councillors approving a comprehensive list of payments and grants, ranging from tree maintenance to donations supporting local groups such as the WI, Southmoor Baby & Toddler group, and The Abingdon Bridge. The council also adopted new policies to support its staff and ensure best practices, including anti-bullying and lone worker policies. The next parish council meeting will be held on Tuesday 6th May, with additional committee meetings scheduled throughout April.

### Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

The Steering Group last met on March 10th. A public meeting was held on 26th March – 8 members of the public attended. Information, data and maps are being drafted into the plan document by the copywriter. The core part of an NDP are the Policies which will include: A Self-Sustaining Village – the need to provide the infrastructure and facilities reasonably be expected in a community of the size of KBS; Green Infrastructure; Sustainability and Biodiversity including Dark Skies; Heritage; Local Housing Needs; Transport and Travel. It is anticipated that the first full draft of the NDP will be available in mid May and will be posted on the KBSPC Facebook page and website www.kbs-parishcouncil.gov.uk.

However, if they do become a major problem and you need to deal with them, please take professional advice and be extremely careful where you put it if you do choose to use poison. Many thanks. ### **KBS Nature**


"She has nothing, in short, to recommend her, but being an excellent walker." So said Mrs Hurst in Pride and Prejudice. And with that in mind the Unofficial Friday Walking Club\*

went off for a ladylike meander around the environs of Basingstoke and Deane on one of the Jane Austen Trails (see https://overtonparishcouncil. gov.uk/overton-jane-austen-trails/ for more information). We began our excursion with an excellent cup of tea (and one of the best Victoria Sponges I have had in a while) at the Honesty Café in Overton. As we headed out of the village, along the route of the River Test, we noted a swathe of watercress – a sign of good water quality one hopes (don't get me started on the quality of the Windrush – I could be writing for days!). The River Test is a chalk stream renowned for its trout fishing. The water was sparklingly clear and we did spot a chub from the bridge in Overton. We wound our way along the route of the River Test and headed to Ashe (rather disappointing source of the Test), then onto Deane and back to Overton via Steventon (birthplace of said Miss Austen). We witnessed skylarks at close quarters, singing frantically as they ascended into the sky and also had a close encounter with a red kite swooping down on a



dead rabbit. As we passed Ashe Park, the woods were full of primroses and wood anemones and, by the time this column is published, the whole place should be bursting with bluebells.

I am currently training for the Great South Run. I am not an athlete by any stretch of the imagination and I have been overtaken by people walking when I've been out on one of my waddles. However, I usually try to time my training early in the day and often have lovely encounters with wildlife – including a stoat, deer and being mown down by a squirrel on Pine Wood Road! However, my favourite moment was last



spring when, as I turned a bend on Digging Lane, a majestic hare jogged out in front of me and sat down in the middle of the road. I am always amazed at how big they are. This splendid fellow was about 3 feet tall and sat on his haunches. I stopped and we both looked at each other deciding on our next move. He eyed me up and down and decided I was less of a threat than a tortoise and jogged on his way.



# Recipe of the month

### **Asparagus & New Potato Frittata**

A simple, low-calorie spring main that uses the season's finest ingredients and is ready in just 20 minutes

# Ingredients: Serves 3 Prepare:10 mins.

- 200g new potatoes quartered
- 100g asparagus tips
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion finely chopped
- 6 eggs beaten

### **Restaurant Review**



### San Marzano

70 High Street, Witney, OX28 6HJ



San Marzano is a traditional Italian Restaurant within easy reach of KBS by car or by bus (15/15A). It is 23 mins in the car with easy free parking for up to 3 hours in the Waitrose long stay or the Woolgate Centre car parks. The multi storey car park in the Woolgate Centre is also nearby, just a 3 minute walk from the restaurant. Access by wheelchair is good.

Our table had been booked on line and a friendly welcome awaited us. We went at

lunchtime and had a choice of tables. The restaurant wasn't overly busy.

The menu was vast with selections of pasta, pizza, risotto, meat and fish dishes. There was also an abbreviated lunch menu, which enabled you to have a good value lunch for £18-21. A full "dolci" menu was later presented for those of us with a desire for afters. I would say that there is a rustic, friendly ambience with a knowledgeable and informative maitre d'. He had a good rapport with all of the guests.

The seating would accommodate a large party at the back and a selection of tables for couples, singles, friends and families. I'm imagining there will be more atmosphere in the evening.

I had the seafood risotto which was plentiful and tasty - mussels, prawns and calamari in a traditional presentation. My friend had a large Venetian Pizza, which was home made with a good base and a tasty sauce. However the anchovies and the capers overpowered the flavour making it very salty.

The dolci were delicious – a wonderful dark chocolate sorbet which was like ice cream (made with soya milk); and a mix of pistachio and salted caramel ice creams. Tasty coffees ended an all in all pleasant lunch. *By Wilrich, two KBS foodies*

### Some Thoughts of a Long Term Resident

We came to live in Southmoor in 1967 and have noticed a substantial change in many aspects of living here. There have been several improvements, such as the by-pass and the arrival of a good bus service to Oxford and Faringdon and between Witney and Abingdon and, of course, our wonderful village hall. We also have a good selection of shops (which do not shut at lunch time as happened in the past). We also had two garages which sold fuel, one during the day and the other late at night and sometimes during the day. I will not attempt to list features which might be classed as a disadvantage.

What we did notice was that there were many serving and retired members of the Royal Air Force living in the village. This was because there were several active RAF stations within a relatively short distance and the personnel had managed to get to one of them as a last posting prior to leaving the service. Many who had retired also continued using their service knowledge by working at a commercial flying and ground training firm based at Kidlington called CSE Aviation (who left the UK and crossed the Atlantic where the weather was more reliable). I encountered a few of these "RAF and ex-RAF types" and found them to be very serious minded in their jobs, but generally cheerful and still full of student humour. An example of this was a story that one of the Transport Command pilots needed, according to his crew, to change his glasses twice on coming in to land! Although I had completed my National Service in the RAF it was not on an operational station so the sense of humour did not really exist.

This brings me to comment on Rob Belk's book "Their Stories" which I have just read.. His description of how some local families lost as many as four sons in combat and to the large number of aircraft fatalities goes to show how these people valued our Country over their own safety. The book describes in great detail how inadequate were the navigational aids of the time and how short was their training. We did carry out training in Canada of aircrew where a large number of them lost their lives. Indeed, when I was an apprentice at The Royal Aircraft Establishment at Farnborough, the lad with whom I shared a room had lost his Father in a training flying accident in Canada during the war. One of the other lessons to be learned from the book was how young the aircrew were. A nineteen year old was piloting a multiengined bomber when he lost his life.

In conclusion, I would just like to say how a collection of recent history based in our villages goes to prove how fortunate we are: not just to live in such a pleasant place, but to understand how many of our local forebears gave their lives so that we may spend our time in peace led by a democracy. *Alan Knight*

### It's a tremendous privilege being a member of the Oxford Guild of Tour Guides.

Oxford is a hugely interesting place to visit as it satisfies visitors on so many different levels and with so many different areas of interest. The Guild coursework covers this breadth. We still train, mostly in the quieter winter months, to enhance our knowledge and skills.

This brings me to my most recent course: "A day in the life of a porter at Corpus Christi". Such courses can only take place in the downtime of a college between student terms and conference visits. The porter role ranges widely from security to hotel / Airbnb-style concierge. Porters gain an intimate knowledge of the college and of the people therein. While colleges are indeed upgrading to electronic forms of key security, there are still, in Corpus Christi, 1500 keys to be monitored and maintained.


often students in the library at 3am because it's a beautifully quiet time to study. Scouts clean and change the sheets twice a week.

The current head gardener is also on a scholarship at Kew. The College mascot - a tortoise named Foxe - lives in the President's garden. Corpus can accommodate all students in college buildings. Third and fourth years live immediately in the College grounds and there are ballots for who gets which room – outcomes are based on the previous year's exam results.

Some highlights of my tour were seeing the brilliant painting of Chaplain Judith Maltby, sitting in the chapel, with the Rubens painting "Adoration of the Shepherds" and H A Payne's stained glass window in the background; the dining hall which I had never been in before; a wine cellar; a selection of the College silver which amazingly goes back to the origins of the College in 1517 despite the fact that in the Civil War of 1640 King Charles demanded College silver to melt down to

It is the same room where John Spenser and John Rainolds translated their section of the King James Bible as one of six teams, two of which were in Oxford. It exists today pretty much as it was then!

### 29th May (Thursday) at 10am




Just 14 residents took part on 27th March. Starting from the KBS Village Hall we headed for the Millennium Green where

### From our MP Charlie Maynard



I've been working hard in Westminster and in the constituency, enjoying the work as well as the slightly warmer weather and longer days.

As ever, I've continued to campaign hard on cleaning up our water sector. At Burford Eco day on the 15th I was able to talk a bit about my campaign to stop Thames Water being able to take on further debt, at the expense of bill payers, which I wrote about last month. I also met with people from West Oxfordshire District Council, Brize Norton Parish Council, Windrush Against Sewage Pollution and Thames Water to discuss the 20 years of sewage dumping in Brize Norton. I look forward to seeing progress.

Rare cancers have been another theme of much of my work this month. With my sister, Georgie, 46, who is living with a glioblastoma, I visited the Nuffield Department of Medicine at Oxford University to see how funding from The Brain Tumour Charity is helping to research the most unforgiving cancers. In Westminster, I spoke in a debate in the House about how we can improve research and treatment for rarer cancers – including by improving

access to clinical trials for patients, encouraging more research into rare cancer treatments in the UK by extending patents and when new drugs are developed, ensuring they are quickly made accessible on the NHS. I have also quizzed the Health Minister on why there have been such delays in spending funding which was allocated for brain tumour research back in 2018.

Other Parliamentary work this month included a trip with the Business and Trade Select Committee, to British Aerospace's naval shipyards on the Clyde. I also attended a debate on the Government's latest blow to farmers: shutting down the Sustainable Farming Incentive, with no notice whatsoever.

Here in West Oxfordshire, I have had so many interesting meetings. Mick Morris from the Witney and West Oxfordshire Food Bank met with me to discuss how they support people across the community – huge thanks to him and his team for all of their hard work. Along with some of the other Lib Dem MPs for Oxfordshire, I took a visit to the BMW Mini Group factory at Plant Oxford, to hear about the fascinating history of the plant and the current challenges facing the automotive sector.

I very much enjoyed a visit to Little Dots Nursery in Witney, although it was concerning to hear their experience of delayed SEND referrals for the children they look after. This is a situation which I am

determined to improve locally – and I was grateful to the Minister responsible for SEND for meeting me to discuss the particular challenges in our area. I will be following up on that and will keep residents updated.

I also wanted to give my thanks to members of the Witney Youth Council, who met with me recently to talk through their campaigns for the town – it was brilliant to hear their ideas and I hope we can work together to make some real progress on them.

Finally, towards the end of March, I did a walk across Bampton and Clanfield, Alvescot and Filkins. I had the opportunity to meet lots of residents and representatives from local groups and businesses along the way! It was such an enjoyable day – and thankfully the sun shone throughout! I really look forward to planning the next in my series of constituency walks!




