

Paul Weaving

It is with sadness that we heard of the passing of a very dear friend, both personal and of the village and surrounding area. Born in 1948 to Jack and Nancy, Paul grew up in the village where he lived all his life.

He married Sue in 1973 and they have 3 children and 4 grandchildren who are the fifth generation of Weavings to live in the village. Paul was a stalwart of the village and totally involved in many aspects of village life. He was once Chair of the John Blandy School governors and served on the John Blandy Trust. Paul was one of the first 'green men' in the establishment of the Millennium Green, and it was Paul who constructed the maze. And yes, it does work!

Paul carried on farming following his father and grandfather focussing on arable and beef. Once married he could often be seen driving his tractor round the John Blandy estate at lunchtime to his first home with Sue in Laurel Drive. Alongside farming Paul's other passion was folk music, frequently singing at the Ceilidhs at the old Tiddy Hall in Ascott-under-Wychwood. This is where Caroline and I first encountered Paul. We were later married and moved to Southmoor.

Paul started running his own folk nights at 'Dirty Dudlies' (the old Lamb & Flag) where he had to turn people away on the first night as the pub and car park were full. The folk nights were later held in the larger venue of Buckland Memorial Hall. Paul moved his concerts to the village when the new village hall was completed, which is when I began setting up the lighting for him and continued to do so until Paul retired. There were often 8 concerts each year with a full house each time. Among the many professional artists Paul booked were Fred Wedlock, Bernard Wrigley, Jonny Silvo, Tom Paxton, Show of Hands, The Yetties and Kate Rusby. To celebrate 30 years Paul put on a concert in The Amey Hall, Abingdon with



Lindisfarne. Paul sang with his friend, Chad, for several years, but will be remembered for his group, 'The Last Straw' comprising Paul, Joe and Margaret.

Paul was a giant of a man in every respect: a kind and gentle man with a tremendous, and often mischievous sense of humour. Please see above the Last Straw Logo he used on his promotional material. He juggled farming and folk music and, with the help of Sue, led a rich and full life and will be greatly missed by many. Ian and Caroline Ashby

News from The Parish Council

The Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Parish Council met on March 3rd to discuss key local matters affecting the community. One major agenda item was a planning application for the proposed Willowfields Energy Park, a renewable energy project featuring solar panels and associated infrastructure. Concerns were raised about the visibility of the structures, fire risks, and the impact on local residents. The Council agreed to formally object to the application in its current form, requesting more consideration for community compensation and safety measures.

Financial matters were also addressed, with approval granted for various payments, including over £100,000 for the completion of the long-awaited playground upgrade. In addition, the Council allocated grants to several local groups, including Apple Blossoms WI, Southmoor Baby & Toddler Group, and The Village Hall, ensuring continued support for community initiatives. The Council also agreed to replace the failing defibrillator cabinet at the Village Hall and take action to address mole activity in public areas. Further updates included the ongoing work on the Neighbourhood Development Plan, which aims to guide future growth in the village. A community meeting was announced for March 26th to gather local input. The next Council meeting is scheduled for April 7th, with residents encouraged to attend and participate in discussions that shape the future of the parish.

At an Extraordinary Meeting of the Parish Council held on Friday 7th March, the Council agreed to reengage Mark Doodes, a planning consultant, to assess the recent amendments made by Nicholas King Homes on its planning application P24/V2357/O, and to accept his fee of £995.

Kingston Bagpuize with Southmoor Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

A meeting was held on 10th March 2025, 6.30 pm, in the tea room at KINGSTON BAGPUIZE HOUSE. The update since the last meeting covered the following:

Progress with MJA Consulting on transport, flooding, green infrastructure measures including night skies.

The copywriters' request for a definitive list of objectives and policies. The Steering Group discussed the need to clarify details of the Settlement boundary.

Topics to be covered by policies:

- 1. A SELF-SUSTAINING VILLAGE the need for improved infrastructure and facilities with Health and Education priorities.
- 2. Green infrastructure: a. Protection of woodland; b. Biodiversity c. Protection of watercourses.
- 3. Heritage: a. Conservation Area b. Listed buildings not in conservation area c. Consideration for Scout Hut originally the old school and WW2 control tower on the site of the old airfield to be considered 'non-designated' heritage assets.
- 4. Transport.
- 5. Housing design: a. Coalescence with regard to Springhill. b. Infill but not back-land.



A frog he did a wooing-go! And they are certainly causing waves in our ponds. The sunshine over the few days in early March has finally brought a touch of spring and a frogspawn frenzy. It has also been good to see the hazel blooming, but how many of us ever notice the tiny red female flower tucked behind the far showier male yellow catkin (thanks Mr C for the photo)?

Last month I promised you an update on an Unofficial Friday Walking Club trip to Greenham Common. If you've never been I recommend it! There are 3 car parks around the Greenham and Crookham Commons and we used the main car park at the Control Tower (RG19 8DB, SU 499 651) mainly because it gave easy access to the Control Tower with its excellent café (dog-friendly if you need to know). The control tower not only provides an excellent panoramic view of Greenham Common, it also tells the interesting history of the Common from its days as an RAF station, through the years when it was used as a base for nuclear weapons and when the Women's Peace Camp was set up through to its decommissioning and designation as public parkland. The Common now forms the largest area of lowland heath in West Berkshire. There was not a lot of wildlife around on the day we visited, but there is the possibility to hear nightingales (if you are lucky) or catching a glimpse of Dartford warblers. If you are interested in reading a personal perspective of Greenham Common and its surrounding environs, I can recommend On Gallows Down by Nicola Chester.







My journey to work is not quite 'trains, planes and automobiles', but I do drive to Seacourt, walk into the centre of Oxford and then bus it up to Headington. From there I walk to the Churchill along a

stretch known as the Boundary Brook Wildlife Corridor. There is always plenty of birdsong at that time of the morning and it's where I usually hear my first woodpeckers of the year drumming on the big trees. Spotting the first snowdrops and then celandines make the commute a far more pleasurable experience.

A few weeks ago, I was walking past the Castle Mound on my way to work when a fox trotted out in front of me and crossed the road. He stopped and had a cursory sniff of some rubbish by the kerb, turned his nose up and went on his way. Obviously, he must have already had the full English breakfast at Malmaison ...

Next month – another Unofficial Friday Walking Club adventure and close encounters of a hare-y kind.

Recipe of the month

Hot Cross Buns

Preparation about 2 hours Cooking 10 to 30 mins

Ingredients. Makes 12 Buns

• 500g/1lb 2oz strong white flour, plus extra for dusting

• 75g/2³/₄oz caster sugar 2 tsp mixed spice

1 tsp ground <u>cinnamon</u>
 1 <u>lemon</u>, finely grated zest only

10g/½oz salt
 10g/½oz fast-action dried yeast

40g/1½oz <u>butter</u> 300ml/10fl oz <u>milk</u>
 1 free-range <u>egg</u>, beaten 200g/7oz <u>sultanas</u>

50g/1¾oz finely chopped mixed candied peel

oil, for greasing

For the topping

75g/2¾oz plain flour

2 tbsp golden syrup, for glazing

Method

- Put the flour, sugar, spices and lemon zest into a large bowl and mix together. Then add the salt and yeast, placing them on opposite sides of the bowl.
- 2. Melt the butter in a pan and warm the milk in a separate pan. Add the egg and use your hands to bring the mixture together, incorporating the flour from the edges of the bowl as you go. Gradually add the remaining milk, to form a soft pliable dough (you may not need all of the milk).
- 3. Tip the dough out on to a lightly floured work surface. Knead by hand incorporating the sultanas and mixed peel into the dough. Lightly knead for 10 minutes until silky and elastic and forming a smooth ball. (The kneading can also be done in a food mixer with a dough hook.) Oil a bowl and place the dough in a bowl, cover with cling film and leave to rest in a warm place for about 1½ hours or until doubled in size.
- 4. Turn the risen dough out on to a lightly floured surface. Knock back and knead for a further 5 minutes. Return to the bowl, cover with cling film and leave in a warm place to rise for a further hour, or until doubled in size.
- Turn the dough out again on to a floured surface and divide into 12 equal pieces, shaping each of these
 into a ball. Line 1-2 baking trays with paper and place the balls on the tray, placing them fairly close
 together and flattening them slightly.
- 6. Slip each baking tray into a large clean polythene bag, making sure the bag doesn't touch the buns. Leave for 40-60 minutes until the buns have doubled in size.
- 7. Preheat the oven to 220C/200C Fan/Gas 7.
- 8. For the topping, add the flour to a bowl with 100ml/3½fl oz water. Mix together to make a paste and spoon into the icing bag.
- 9. When the buns have risen remove the polythene bags and pipe a cross on each bun.
- 10. Bake for 15-20 minutes until pale golden-brown, turning the baking trays round halfway through if necessary.
- 11. Melt the golden syrup in a pan and while the buns are still warm, brush the buns with a little syrup to give a nice shine, before setting aside to cool on a wire rack.

Restaurant Review



PHO in Westgate



We thought we would go out for lunch and decided to go somewhere that would hopefully provide a quick meal and was central. We chose Pho restaurant, in the Westgate Shopping Centre. It is part of a chain that offers 'healthy' Vietnamese street food.

We booked online and received a reminder the day before.

After a short ride on the S6 and a walk, we arrived at the restaurant on the top floor, tucked away with a few other restaurants, with a lift available to


reach the top level.

We were greeted by friendly staff and shown to a lovely booth table. The restaurant was busy with a mix of group sizes and ages, families, and work parties. There were a variety of table sizes, well-spaced apart. Thankfully, there were none of the bench tables you find in some oriental restaurants, which can be more challenging to sit on! It was styled in a modern way, decorated with lots of wood and a Vietnamese street theme painting on the wall, with large windows allowing plenty of light in. It was lively and had a buzzy feel to it.

The menu is extensive, and it specialises in pho noodle soup, the national dish of Vietnam. There are sharing starters, and a mix of soup, noodles, curries and rice dishes for mains, with plenty of vegan and vegetarian options.

The drinks menu has a good selection of beers, wine, cocktails, soft drinks and a variety of fruit and veg smoothies with some interesting combinations. We were tempted by them but resisted.

We chose prawn crackers to share which were crispy, tasty and not greasy, served with a dip which we enjoyed.



My friend had a chicken thigh rice bowl which again was a generous portion with a varied combination of meat and vegetables and both colourful and tasty. Much enjoyed.

We were full after our meal, so we were not able to try the puddings even though we were tempted. They included ice creams, waffles and banana fritters.

The only disappointment we had was no decaffeinated coffee available to finish an otherwise lovely meal, served promptly by friendly attentive staff.



Would you like to predict what is going to happen in your future? I could guess that you are going to visit the Weston Library to see one of the three current exhibitions.

The first is 'Oracles, Omens and Answers'. Entering the exhibition room, spin the wheel and see which number comes up to identify the object you should read. Is it chance or fate? "See how societies have turned to divination to ask questions that resonate with us today: on health, relationships, money and politics." Select from the wonderful display of methods your chosen path to future knowledge. Will it be oracle bones from the Shang dynasty over 3000 years ago? Or palmistry, the interpretation of your future from your own hand? Spider divination practice? Interpretation of the celestial configuration? Or will the answer lie in using the AI generated tarot cards?





The second is 'Listen In: How Radio Changed the Home'. Radio was the first mass communication system. It changed our lives. There followed some significant steps in communication. Next came television invented by John Logie Baird, a Scotsman. The third great leap was the World Wide Web invented by Tim Berners-Lee, a graduate of Queens College and Oxford Fellow. Now we are dealing with and learning Artificial Intelligence (AI). However, radio was the first. Discover the previously unpublished first-person accounts of how it changed lives. You can even indulge in the audio booth!

The third, is a smaller side cabinet exhibition 'Magna Carta 1215 & 1225' celebrating the 800th anniversary of the definitive issue of Magna Carta - one of the most

important documents in democracy. There are three different versions on display. Magna Carta is a contract between the King and his nobles hand copied so that everyone has a record of the deal. The original 1215 version was not a success. It was Henry III and his 1225 version which ensured its place in history. My favourite is the one with the little holes in it. It is of course written on parchment (stretched young animal skin) and in its time it has been folded and the edge nibbled by a mouse, hence the holes.

Don't delay! These are, as always, temporary exhibitions. You have until the 21st April for Magna Carta. Look out (check online) for the free tours/talks of these exhibits by experts. Go and secure a knowledge of your future as soon as possible!



The Juniors have completed the Winter nets and will have their first outdoor training on Friday 25th April at the cricket club, 6-8pm. We then have a full season of games planned



From our MP Charlie Maynard

Thank you for taking the time to read my update. I hope you have been keeping well this last month and are looking forward to a break with friends and family over Easter.

I wrote last month about my campaign to sort out failing Thames Water and that I had submitted evidence to the High Court urging them not to let Thames Water take on another £3bn of debt. Supported by local campaigners including Windrush Against Sewage Pollution (WASP) and with an amazing legal team who all gave their time for free, I argued that I did not believe that this was in the interests of Thames Water's customers. The money we pay through our bills needs to be spent on repairing our

water infrastructure and cleaning up our rivers, not paying for Thames Water's billions in debt and the huge interest repayments on it. Regrettably the court decided to let them go ahead with this plan, but I was able to appeal the decision. I will of course continue to keep residents updated on my work on this.

In Parliament I recently attended a debate on the disastrous decision to shut down the Sustainable Farming Incentive, a vital funding stream for farmers which also supports more sustainable farming methods and nature recovery. This decision was briefed to press without giving farmers any notice at all – leaving local farmers totally in the lurch, many of whom will have been counting on this revenue. This on top of the fact that farmers in Oxfordshire are still reeling from the Government's inheritance tax changes, which could strip them of family businesses they have built over generations. To deal the sector another blow so quickly – delivered in such an abrupt way – is awful.

I've been out and about in the constituency a lot over the past month and lucky enough to see lots of good work going on, but also to hear about issues and challenges people are facing. Among these were visits to two schools in Witney, where, amongst other things, I spoke to teachers about special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) provision.

I also visited the Defence Academy at Shrivenham, which was a great opportunity to get some insights into the challenges facing our military personnel. A few days later, back in Shrivenham, I had a great

time at the Zumba Gold class, part of a nationwide 'Let's Dance' campaign. I also paid a visit to Matthews Cotswold Flour Mill in Shipton-under-Wychwood, which prides itself on producing the highest quality flour to sell to customers locally and nationally. It was great to see the mill at work and to discuss local issues with the staff. I also recently visited the Bradwell Grove Estate, which runs the Cotswold Wildlife Park. The owner, Reggie Hayworth, showed me around and we discussed the challenges farmers are facing locally.
