Chairman's Chat

The blackberry season is well and truly behind us now – and a bumper season it has been. It is sad to think that when the developers finally move into the fields to the East of the village and the A415, one of the first things they will do is grub out all the bramble bushes that line the old London Road between Kingston Bagpuize and Fyfield that have been so prolific in the years since the road was first closed to traffic.

Things are also moving to the West of the village. Following on last month's on-line consultation, Nicholas King Homes expect to be putting a Planning Application into VOWHDC early in the new year for 249 new houses (35% affordable) to be built to the west of 'Little London' on land bordered by the A420 and the Faringdon Road.

On a completely different subject, a small contingent from the History Society recently made the trip to Stanford in the Vale on a wet Sunday afternoon for the launch of Southmoor's Dr David Ashby's Stanford in the Vale - the Hidden Past Revealed. David, a lecturer at the University of Winchester, first began his investigations as a Scout Leader in 2008 and the book, written as part of the Stanford in the Vale Research Project, describes how the village evolved

The Priority Services Register

Hopefully, you were able to have your electric blanket safety tested last month. Have you also signed up to the PRIORITY SERVICES REGISTER (PSR)?

This, too, is a free service which ensures, provided you meet the relevant criteria, that you receive priority support and information if you are ever without electricity, gas or water either in an emergency or because of planned repair works, etc.

To be eligible for this free service, you must be of pensionable age or meet one of several criteria such as: use medical equipment reliant on electricity or water; suffer from a disability or chronic illness; have a hearing or sight condition, depression or impairment of sense of smell. If you suffer from any of these disabilities, you are eligible whatever your age, as you are should there be any children in the family under the age of five.

You can register online at www.thepsr.co.uk, or alternatively call your gas or electricity supplier to register over the phone. For further information and confirmation of your eligibility, ring AgeUK on 0345 450 1276 or email helpline@ ageukoxfordshire.org.uk

CAN'T SING. WON'T SING!!!




That was just over a year ago....if you want to hear the gentlemen sing now, catch up with them at the Kingston Café on Thursday,

October at Millennium Green Junior Parkrun

October is always a lovely time at Millennium Green with all the Autumn leaves. This Autumn has been a bit chilly and the puddles have appeared early this year. But that has not deterred our amazing runners. Even on a wet and windy day, we had 33 runners braving the elements and it spurred everyone on to achieve some fast finish times too!

We have awarded some rare 100 wristbands this month to Ahmed, Matt and Charlotte which is a fantastic achievement. We have gratefully welcomed 3 new Duke of Edinburgh Volunteers - Martha, Alice and Katie who have taken over on barcode scanning. We also couldn't do without Aleezah and Rebecca on timekeeping, who continue to come every week even though they are no longer working towards any Duke of Edinburgh award. And Annie Richardson even came to volunteer on her birthday! Happy Birthday Annie! Parkrun will keep you young.



What is a junior parkrun? It is for children aged 4 to 14 (and their families) to run a timed 2km run every Sunday morning at 9.00am. It is free and it is fun and there is no time limit to complete the course.

It's easy to register with parkrun, just head over to their website https://www.parkrun.org.uk/ and you can complete a free registration form in a matter of minutes. You will then have a unique barcode which is scanned each time you run so you can track your progress. You can earn wristbands for completing a specific number of runs (11, 22, 50, 100, 250) and you can take your barcode to any other parkrun in the country (and abroad) and take part in another junior parkrun or even join the adults on a Saturday morning (providing a parent or family member can run and keep up with you).

Too old to be a junior runner but want to volunteer? We welcome volunteers to help each week and we always need marshals, time keepers, barcode scanners and people to set up and clear away. If you register with parkrun as well then we can book you in and you can earn volunteer credits for t-shirts for all the times you volunteer. Plus you get to be part of a happy band of volunteers who like to get up and out on a Sunday morning and cheer on our amazing runners.





Nature Notes - Nice Weather for Ducks Fungi

As a nation we do tend to talk about the weather rather a lot and this

year it is probably justified. A friend in another south Oxfordshire village reports that up to the start of last month, his rain gauge had so far recorded 164% of the annual average rainfall, with three months of the year still to go! The effects that conditions like we have seen impacts on our wildlife in many and various ways. One group of organisms however that always seem to do well in wetter years are fungi.

The range and size of fungi to be discovered is huge with there being upwards of 15000 species identified in the UK. Most of these have often unpronounceable scientific names, with those bearing "proper" names limited to either the ones that have a distinctive appearance or are edible or more alarmingly the ones that can kill you. From an edibility point of view we often split the fungi world into two camps - mushrooms which we feel comfortable in eating and toadstools which

we do not. Death Cap is probably the name that springs to mind and the rightful fear its reputation has engendered in most of us since childhood probably goes a long way to explain our reticence when it comes to foraging for fungi in the wild. In between the good and the very bad there sits a

range of others that either don't taste too nice or will give you hallucinations or make you sick - or all of those! One that falls in to the later camp is the distinctive red and white spotted Fly Agaric that is most



frequently seen on the dust jackets of books on the subject, so it was therefore really nice to hear from a reader who had come across a small troop (for that is the term) of them at the back of Wellington Way. Hearing from other sources too that it seemed a good year for them I ventured out in the garden to see if I could track down one of my own down. Sadly not, but I did locate a whole range of others that were equally fascinating that I snapped with my phone camera, but I shan't be tasting any. The rain is still persisting as I write this so I'll settle down with a fungi guide to try to put a name to them all.

Recipe of the month

Autumn pudding

https://www.bbc.co.uk/food/recipes/autumn_pudding_30736

Ingredients (Serves 6)

- · 3 tbsp olive oil
- · 400g/14oz English pears, peeled and cut into quarters
- 300g/10oz cooking apples, peeled and cut into quarters
- 500g/17oz ripe plums, halved
- 450g/Ilb fresh blackberries
- · 200g/7oz caster sugar
- 15g/½oz butter
- sunflower oil, for greasing
- · 10 thick slices white bread, crusts removed

Preparation time: Previous day **Cooking time:** 1-2 hours



Preparation

- 1. Place the fruit, sugar and butter into a saucepan and cook on a medium heat for 15 minutes, or until softened. (Don't stir too often as the fruit will become mushy.)
- **2.** Remove the pan from the heat and pour the contents into a colander set over a large bowl. Leave to stand for 8-10 minutes, stirring once or twice, so as much juice as possible is released by the fruit. You should end up with around 600ml/20fl oz.
- **3.** Pour the fruit juice back into the saucepan, bring to a simmer and cook for 10-15 minutes, or until the volume of the liquid has reduced by half. Remove the pan from the heat and set aside to cool for 20-30 minutes.
- **4.** Lightly oil a 1.5 litre/2 pint pudding basin and line with clingfilm, leaving plenty overhanging the edge. Cut a slice of bread using a round cutter and dip it quickly into the fruit juice. Place in the base of the pudding basin.
- **5.** Cut the other bread slices in half and dip one at a time into the juice. Arrange in slightly overlapping vertical pieces around the inside of the basin, making sure they are soaked in juice without being soggy.
- **6.** Once all the sides of the basin are lined with bread, pour half of the remaining fruit juice over the drained fruit and stir very lightly until it looks plump and glossy. Spoon the mixture into the pudding basin.
- 7. Dip the remaining slices of bread in the fruit juice and place over the top of the pudding, trimming the bread where necessary to give a neat finish. Reserve any remaining fruit juice in a small bowl.
- **8.** Place the pudding onto a dinner plate. Cover the top of the pudding with the cling film, place a plate on top (make sure it fits inside the basin) and weigh down with a couple of tins. Chill in the fridge overnight.
- **9.** When ready to serve, remove the weights and plate and open the clingfilm. Place a serving plate on top of the pudding and invert. Remove the basin and peel off the cling film. Brush any gaps where white bread is showing with the reserved fruit juice.

Restaurant Review

Hanney Spice Restaurant, 1 School Road, West Hanney OX12 0LA



A friend had recommended the Hanney Spice Restaurant after picking up a delicious takeaway from the friendly staff so we decided to give it a go.

After a 9 min drive from Kingston Bagpuize, we parked outside where others were parked already to pick up their takeaway. It seems popular for takeaways. There was also plenty of parking behind the restaurant and disabled access was good into it.

We were shown to our table in a small dining room that was bright and quite colourful where the tables had lovely white tablecloths (which I thought was brave for an Indian restaurant.) There were already quite a few people there and the staff were clearly busy and pleasant, if not the most attentive.



We spent time looking at the menu which was huge with plenty of curry options and a few vegetarian and vegan options but unfortunately there were no such options amongst the chef's special

page. There was a separate seafood menu too and plenty of advice on food allergens (a whole section dedicated to this in the menu and many details given).

After browsing through it we Crab ordered Maliber and Prawn Puris and **Poppadoms** to start. The crab fritters were disappointing as it was hard to




distinguish the crab and were not particularly appetising. They were deep fried and tasteless. The prawns were tasty but the fried bread accompaniment was rather greasy. We did enjoy the crunchy poppadoms and tasty relishes though and we did not manage to finish them.

Our main courses were a mixed bag too. The Meeen Molee was delicious. There was a good portion of fish in it. The chicken pasanda too was greatly enjoyed, with a generous amount of chicken in a tasty sauce with a mild and tasty level of spice. Not so successful with the Vegetarian Balti which was covered in a layer of oil and rather heavy on large slices of under cooked onion which was disappointing having tasted lovely baltis in the past in Birmingham. The naans were large and tasty and the Peshwari Naan was particularly appreciated, the portions were generous, and a side was included with the Balti and the pilau rice chosen was colourful.

The restaurant was busy and the other guests seemed to be enjoying their meals so maybe we were unlucky in our choices. On a Monday night they do a banquet, 5 courses for £16.99 which might be worth considering. The cost was reasonable for the meal, our starters were £5.15 and £6.50 and mains (£14.95 to £10.95) With sides about £3.95.

We left feeling disappointed as the restaurant had the potential of a good meal but was not delivered to us. *Wilrich, Two KBS Foodies*

Plastic production has sharply increased over the last 70 years. In 1950, the world produced just two million tonnes. It now produces over 450 million tonnes and it's estimated around 350 million tonnes of this plastic ends up as waste. 6 million tonnes heads to rivers or coastlines, then 1.7 million tonnes of this finds its way to the ocean. Sadly, as good as plastic can be for many things such as food storage containers for use again and again,

once finished with, it only breaks down into smaller and eventually tiny pieces.

With plenty of rivers nearby to us here in KBS we can do our bit to help the sea creatures under threat by not dropping any plastic as litter. Magnus Macfarlane The Oratory

I am constantly surprised and delighted by new things that I find in Oxford.



Religion in this country's history has meant from time time either Catholics or the Protestants had dominance usually to the exclusion and detriment of the other. In the middle of the 1800s, a compromise was being reached. The suppression of Catholicism

relaxed and, in Oxford, Saint Aloysius Catholic Church was built. Today, it is the Oxford Oratory.

Tucked away as it is and set back on the Woodstock Road just up from Saint Giles, you would be forgiven for thinking, when looking at the outside façade, that it was not a particularly

imposing building. As you enter, however, there instantly a wow factor. Facing you behind the altar in a semicircle is the reredos: two rows of statuettes, 26 figures wide, with 20 figureheads above, in the middle a relatively tiny figure of Christ in an enormous spire. Along right-hand side richly decorated side altars, including the lady chapel and The Lady Chapel one full of relics.



There is a fundamental difference between and Protestantism. Catholicism Catholics decorate a church to the glory of God. They paint the walls and ceilings, they fill it with Saints, relics and stained glass. Protestants believe all this to be a distraction from praising God, so they whitewash the walls, smash the Saints, the relics and the stained glass. Being so new, this church has not experienced the Protestant alterations.

Amongst the Saints, there are some lovely surprises. The top row is all British Saints, including St Edmund of Abingdon, after whom St Edmunds Hall is named; Saint Frideswide, the patron saint of Oxford; and nestled between them is a king, Saint Edward the Confessor. The four nearest the congregation feature Saints Andrew, David, George and Patrick, our patron saints.

Although built in 1875, it was at first run by the Jesuits and did not become the Oratory until 1990. The Oratory was brought to England by Saint John Henry Newman, founder of the Oxford Movement, although not to Oxford in his lifetime.

There is a Newman shrine.

Today, most of the walls are painted whitish indeed, in 1940 it was in battleship Grey - cheap and available. The



murals underneath are gradually being restored. Give it a look, go for the wow.

Dog News

This month I thought I would cover a few training tips that we've picked up over the years with our own dog.

<u>Pulling</u>: I think most of us have experienced a dog pulling on the lead. A trainer showed us a couple of very effective techniques.

- 1. Have your dog on your left, have the left hand holding the lead but the rest looped in the right hand. If your dog starts to pull away from you, release the looped lead and turn 180 degrees to the right to go back. Then start again. Your dog will soon understand that the progress forward will continue if they don't pull.
- 2. Another technique is just to stop if the dog is pulling. Once the dog stops moving forward as well, continue walking.
- 3. Walking to heel using a treat reward can also work quite effectively.

Recall: We have been working with our dog on recall with a whistle. A trainer explained that if you are shouting for your dog to return, your voice can sound anxious and sharp, not a great incentive for your dog to return to you. The whistle however, holds no emotion. The trainer also suggested a high value reward that they called 'the jackpot'. Some meat and cheese is a real prize. This technique is working well and our dog knows that the whistle is worth responding to.

<u>Citronella collar</u>: We were introduced to this whilst doing sheep training with our dog. The product is in a small unit attached under the chin on the dog's collar. The spray is controlled by a remote unit. This can be used for all kinds of unwanted behaviours. The technique involves having a key word that you call to your dog as soon as they start to exhibit the unwanted behaviour e.g. 'leave', followed by a short spray.

Pest Corner



Rodent season is upon us once more and will be with us until spring time, when the weather is warmer and food is starting to become available again.

It's the time of year that we find unwanted guests in our sheds and gardens as they look for food and shelter from the elements.

When deciding to tackle the problem yourself, PLEASE think about safety in regards to what you are using, how much and where.

Open traps can catch birds (all of which are protected as are their eggs and nests), bats and hedgehogs and bait can be taken from all kinds of wildlife as well as pets and children.

Think about where you place such things and consider using lockable boxes. There are specific boxes made to stop hedgehogs entering them and minimising the risk of them eating what they shouldn't or being caught in a trap.

20mph Speed Limits

Oxfordshire County Council proposes to make an order under the road traffic Regulation Act 1984 to bring in 20 mph speed limits in part of Kingston Bagpuize and Southmoor.

The roads included, for their entire length unless stated, are: Acacia Gardens, Blandy Avenue, Draycott Road from its junction with Faringdon Road going north to the gated end points south of the A420, Fir Tree Close, Greenheart Way, Hanney Road from its junction with Faringdon Road southwards to a point 85 metres south of the junction with Town Pond Lane, Larch Close, Laurel Drive, Lime Grove, Redwood Close, Stonehill Lane, Town Pond Lane.

Existing 30 mph speed limits on the main routes through the village will remain on the A415 Abingdon Road, Spring Hill, and Oxford Road as well as the remaining village roads not listed. 
Book Review

THE FIGURINE, by Victoria Hislop, published by Headline.

When we go on holiday, many of us like to bring home souvenirs to remind us of happy times, or to recall the atmosphere or culture of the places visited. This can be especially true if our holiday destination is so very different from our familiar home environment. This was also true in times past when the wealthy went on Grand European Tours and brought back items for their own personal collections to display their wealth.

This is the background for Victoria Hislop's latest book, The Figurine. Set in Greece, and beginning in the 1960's, the story follows a young English girl, Helena, as she learns about her Greek heritage against a backdrop of dictatorship and the roles played by her Greek family. As she grows, so does her appreciation of ancient Greek artefacts and her understanding of beauty and where it belongs.

We are introduced to her student friends in Oxford and the man who charms her and everyone else. The author is skilled in evoking the landscape and atmosphere of Greece, which she knows so well and loves. She is a storyteller who draws the reader on to discover more about the land and its history, the characters and their secrets as the story unfolds.



The book begins slowly but rewards the reader with increasing twists and turns before the finale. Readers of other Hislop novels will enjoy this new one and new readers will be encouraged to find her previous works.
